



PAWPRINT BADGES

- Duild a bug hotel or compost heap from logs, sticks and other plant material.
- Decorate a plant pot with your Action for Insects pledge and plant some seeds in it that will attract pollinators.
- Design and make a seed packet; use our free resource to help you.

Why?

Seed packets are ideal for helping to spread the Action for Insects message. Why not make a few seed packets and then give them as gifts or as a Random Act of Kindness?

- Upcycle a washing up bowl and make a mini pond. Visit wildlifewatch.org.uk/how-make-mini-pond for more info!
- Design a garden using our free resource. Where will you create different habitats to support insects at different stages of their development?
- Create a planting guide with information on insect friendly plants for all seasons. Share it with friends or neighbours and create a bug friendly neighbourhood! Check out wildlifewatch.org.uk/activities for some ideas and more info.
- Not got a garden? Upcycle an old bucket or tyre to make a mini garden suitable for a balcony/courtyard. Alternatively create a mini habitat in a plant pot or window box.
- Make your own seed bomb.

What?

Seed bombs are little balls of earth packed with seeds. Used by guerrilla gardeners for brightening up public spaces they leave little explosions of colour and patches of wild flowers. They're great fun to make and date back to ancient times. In Japan they were known as tsuchi dango or 'earth dumplings' and in ancient Egypt were used to restore farmland after the Nile's spring flood.

- Design an insect. Get creative and invent your own insect. What will the 3 body parts look like? How about the wings? Where will it live? What are its favourite plants/food?
- Make your own sweep net for your bug hunt.
- Colour in your own butterfly memo peg. Use our free resource to help you and brighten up your fridge or workspace.

Tood



- Crushed egg shells can be used as a natural barrier for slugs in the garden instead of harmful pesticides. Make a recipe using eggs and then use the egg shells to protect your flourishing garden.
- Shop chemical free.

What?

Pesticide Action Network UK have created a great resource called 'Dirty Dozen, Clean 15' showing pesticide residues on common fruit and veg. Buy veggies from the 'clean' list and make a meal with them as an extra challenge.

- Supermarket sweep! See how many products you can find in your local shop/supermarket marked as Fairtrade or Rainforest Alliance Certified. Both these accreditations help farmers to farm more sustainably and restrict the use of chemicals.
- Host your own funky fruit and veg competition with friends and family. Who can grow or find the wonkiest, weirdest looking piece of fruit/veg?

Did You Know?

16.9 thousand tons of pesticides are sprayed every year across our countryside and that doesn't include what's used in gardens, towns and cities. Harmful chemicals kill plants and insects and cause pollution of our waterways.

- Take a look in your fridge or cupboard. Which foods rely on pollinators to grow? Were you surprised?
- Discover food chains and food webs that include insects.
- Make your own hungry caterpillar fruit kebabs based on Eric Carle's, *The Very Hungry Caterpillar*.
- Bake your own caterpillar Swiss roll cake.
- Charlotte fondly calls raisins 'flies'. Bake a cake or make biscuits using 'flies'.
- There are 60 species of dung beetle in the UK, make some edible 'dung balls'. That's chocolate truffles to you and me!
- \triangleright Bake some biscuits to look like ladybirds or your favourite insects.
- One bee colony can make 100kg of honey per year, that's 220 jars!! Make some honey biscuits or honey cake.

Games



- Take part in an insect quiz. Find one for free at: www.wildlifetrusts.org/insect-quiz
- Create your own set of Insect Trump cards; use our free Trump Cards Template to help you.
- Bug or not? Take a look at a bunch of creepy crawlies and minibeasts; can you correctly identify which of them are actually insects?

Did You Know?

All insects share the same body design of 3 parts (the head, thorax and abdomen) and some have wings. Examples are butterflies, beetles, bees, ants and dragonflies.

- Have a good old fashioned beetle drive. Roll the dice to build your beetle and the person who builds their bug first is the winner.
- Moth or not? Can you tell the difference between a moth and a butterfly? Take a look at some pictures and see if you can identify the differences between the two.
- \nearrow Play a game or two of bug bingo.
- \nearrow Have a caterpillar crawling competition.

What?

Imagine a sack race but horizontal. Jump in your sack or sleeping bag and transform yourself into a caterpillar. Then, race to wriggle to the end of the course. Fun for all ages! We dare you not to laugh when you start wiggling and wriggling along!

- Act like an insect. Decide on actions for different types of insects and then have a game a little like Simon Says but with your bug actions. Last one to complete the action correctly is out.
- \nearrow Crickets are an insect; have a game of cricket with friends/family.
- Go on a 'bug hunt' treasure hunt. Can you find the bugs hidden around your garden or home? They could be pompoms or painted rocks.
- Have a stag beetle ring toss. Create a pair of antlers like the stag beetle's (which are actually over-sized mandibles) and compete tossing rings over them. Score points for each ring you get on an antler.
- \nearrow Feed the hungry caterpillar throwing bean bags of 'food' into a hoop.

- Visit your local garden centre and find some peat-free compost. If you can't find any why not talk to the owner about the benefits of peat-free? Find out more at: www.wildlifewatch.org.uk/actions/how-go-peat-free-your-garden
- Campaign against the use of pesticides. Check out the work of PAN UK at: www.pan-uk.org/supermarkets
- Switch to natural cleaning products! What we wash down the drain has a big impact on our aquatic insects. Be kind to them and choose eco-friendly options. What swaps can you make at home/school/work?
- Go on a bug hunt; see how many species you can find. Create a spotting sheet at: www.wildlifewatch.org.uk/things-do/get-started-your-spotter-sheets or grab a ready made one at: www.wildlifewatch.org.uk/activities
- Take a survey of your garden or local green space. How insect friendly is it and how can it be improved? If the space doesn't belong to you why not share your findings with the owner and tell them what you've learnt about making spaces more insect friendly?
- Do something to raise awareness of insect decline in your local community. You could put on a performance, write and perform a song, create posters or take part in a discussion on your local radio station.
- Volunteer to help manage a local green space or park. Can you help with the planting or encourage more infrequent mowing?
- Find out about the life cycle of different insects in the UK.
- Read a bug related book like *The Very Hungry Caterpillar* by Eric Carle or enjoy some insect themed poetry in *Cricket in the Thicket* by Carol Murray.
- Explore water surface tension with a science experiment. The chemicals that make soaps bubbly are called surfactants and take away the surface tension of the water. This means insect like pond-skaters fall in and can't survive.
- Paint some pebbles to look like insects to brighten up a local green space or your garden, window box or yard.
- Help spread the word about Action For Insects and write to a friend to tell them what you've been up to.
