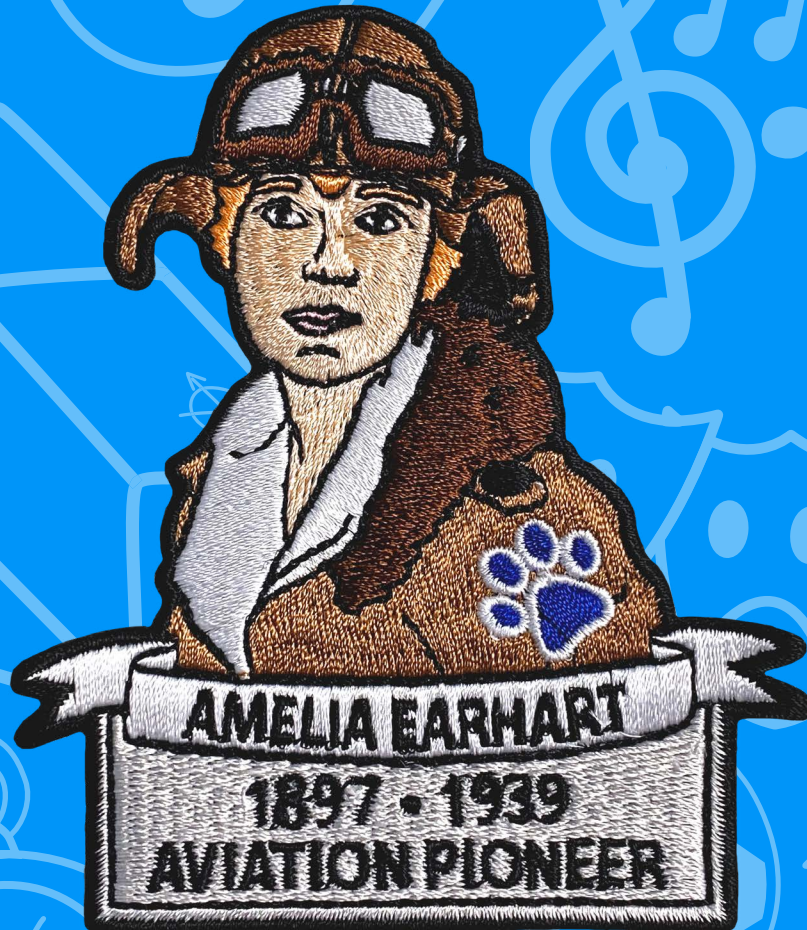


Amelia Earhart Challenge

Make a paper aeroplane and see how far you can fly it.

Why?

Amelia's first plane was a Kinner Airster that was bright yellow. Because of its colour she called it 'the canary'.



Build your own anemometer to measure the wind speed and direction.



Design an outfit to wear when flying. Earhart designed a two-piece aviation suit for the Ninety-Nines and also became one of the first celebrities to create her own fashion line.



Make a paper helicopter or spinning jenny.



Create a parachute for an egg. See if it can land without breaking.

Why?

An article from the New York Times on 3rd June, 1935 said that Amelia Earhart used her first parachute making an initial jump, with a new device from a 115 foot tower. She also carried Switlik Parachutes on her record breaking solo flights.



Build and fly your own kite.



Make a weather vane using an old pop bottle and garden cane.



Create your own travel diary or journal to record your travels.



Build your own lolly stick bi-plane.



Earhart flew solo to Hawaii, make your own lei garland.



Read the book *When Amelia Earhart Built a Roller Coaster* by Mark Andrew Weakland and then design your own roller coaster or build a marble run.



Amelia Earhart disappeared in 1937 before being declared dead in January 1939. Make your own magic trick and make something disappear.



Make things fly and build a rocket and launcher.



Create a paper windmill, you could use our Catherine Wheel template.



Make your own wind chimes.

Amelia Earhart was born in Kansas where the first Pizza Hut opened in 1958. Make your own pizza.



Whip up your own hot chocolate, why not pop it in a flask and enjoy it outdoors?

Why?

Amelia is reported to have enjoyed hot chocolate during the 2408 mile flight when she became the first person to fly solo across the Pacific.



Earhart was a nurses aid in Toronto during WW1. Make Poutine, a Canadian form of cheesy chips. Chips served with cheese curds topped with brown gravy.



Kansas state insect is the honey bee. Make honey and mint lemonade or a recipe of your choice using honey. Why not count this towards your Bee Challenge too?!



Amelia was a fan of tomato juice while flying, heating it and storing it in a flask during colder weather like soup. Have a go at making your own tomato juice or tomato soup.



Earhart was reported to also enjoy a few raisins and a hard boiled egg. Learn how to boil an egg and enjoy eggs and soldiers.



On her flight in which she became the first woman ever to fly across the Atlantic, Amelia Earhart landed in Wales. Discover some traditional Welsh dishes and have a go at making one.



Create your own sandwich and drink to take on a flight or create your own in-flight meal.

Did you know?

The first in-flight meals were served in 1919 on the Handley-Page London to Paris route and was a packed lunch consisting of a sandwich and some fruit. The altitude also alters your senses of taste and smell so airline food is more sweet and salty than food served on the ground.



Make your own Boston baked beans. Amelia Earhart was not only a pilot but also a social worker who lived and worked in Boston.



Bake a cake or make biscuits using raisins as Amelia was said to enjoy eating raisins during her flights.

Compete to see how far you can fly your paper planes. Can you make any adaptations to make them fly further?



Play a game of corners using some of the countries Amelia flew to; Wales, Hawaii, Brazil, Australia.



Pack the suitcase relay.

What?

There are two ways to play. The first, each player must load all the items in to the suitcase before racing down the length of the course and back to their team, unpack the suitcase and hand it to the next player. The first team to finish wins. The second, each player must grab an item, run the length of the course and drop the item in the suitcase and run back. The first team to pack their case with all the items wins!



Play a guessing game to see how far some of the countries that Amelia Earhart flew to are from where you live. Find the locations on a map and take a guess then look up the answer and see how close you were.



Have a game of lost luggage matching the luggage tags to the bags and suitcases hidden around your game area, house or meeting place.

How?

Hide a series of suitcases and bags around your home, meeting or playing area. Label each bag with a luggage tag with a name and address. With another set of identical luggage tags, each player must take turns to pick a tag and try and find that piece of luggage.



Fly through the hoops; suspend hula hoops and try flying your paper planes through them. You could score points for the different hoops.



Play musical clouds (musical chairs but with cloud shaped cut outs on the floor instead of chairs).



How many words can you make using the letters in AMELIA EARHART. Use each letter only once. You could play with different words relating to Amelia such as AEROPLANE or AVIATION.



Enjoy some parachute games of your choice.



Name as many things as you can that fly.





Create your own game based around flying.

-  Earhart was born in Kansas, watch the Wizard of Oz, "Toto, I've a feeling we're not in Kansas anymore. We must be over the rainbow!" ~ Judy Garland.
-  Kansas is known as the sunflower state. Try growing your own sun flowers, you could compete with your friends to see how tall you can grow them.
-  The official insect of Kansas is the Honey Bee. Complete your Bee Challenge badge.
-  Find out about the Ninety-Nines and what it takes to become a pilot today.
-  Find out where Amelia Earhart flew find the countries on a map, spot the Atlantic and Pacific oceans and find out some facts about their size.
-  What would you pack in your suitcase if you were flying to different destinations? Somewhere hot, somewhere cold, if you were going skiing or on a boating holiday...gather the items and sort them.
-  Visit your local airport and spot planes. See if you can find out what it takes to become cabin crew for an airline and what the job involves.
-  Earhart was a nurses aid during WWI, find out about some other famous nurses in history.
-  Investigate how planes fly and complete an experiment to demonstrate.
-  Use a hair dryer and a ping pong ball, see how long you can keep the ping pong ball in the air while negotiating round obstacles.
-  Investigate Bernoulli's Principle by blowing on a sheet of paper. Take a look at our Pinterest board for some ideas.
-  Amelia built a roller coaster, take a visit to your local theme park and ride some roller coasters for real.
-  In Boston Amelia Earhart was a social worker and taught English to immigrant children. Create a poster, book or other resource to help someone learn English.
-  Earhart was a true adventurer, have an adventure of your own and visit a new place or travel using a method you haven't used before.
-  Amelia is know for lots of records and was the first person to do lots of things, do something you haven't done before.
