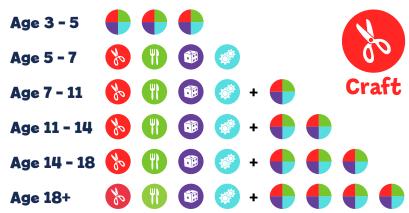




HOW TO: Use Your Challenge Pack

PAWPRINT **BADGES

Create your own stop motion movie clip.

What/How?

The Horse in Motion (1878) was a series of photographs taken by Eadweard Muybridge showing a horse running. When viewed together they formed what we now know as a stop-motion film and it formed an important step in the development of film/movies. There are many apps you can use to create your own stop-motion, we'd recommend Life Lapse or Stop Motion Studio which can be accessed for free.

- Recreate some iconic film scenes as photos, dressing up and creating your own sets.
- See old film cannisters and make them in to something new.
- Design your own film poster either for a film from your imagination or redesign an existing poster from a well-known film.
- Make your own Hollywood Walk of Fame.

What?

The Walk of Fame is a landmark made up of over 2,700 five-pointed stars on the pavements of Hollywood Boulevard and Vine Street in Hollywood.

- Create your own British Academy of Film and Television Arts Award (BAFTA) mask. You could model your own or use a ready made mask as a base.
- Set your own hand prints in clay or plaster like those in "The Forecourt of Stars" outside Grauman's Chinese Theatre in Hollywood.
- Do some DIY and set your name in lights by drilling holes in a piece of wood and adding a string of fairy lights. It's every actors dream to see their name in lights and now you can do the same!
- Make a card for Mother's Day to celebrate a female role model in your life. Hattie Daniels was the first Black actor to win an Oscar for her 1940 portrayal of Mammy in *Gone With the Wind*.
- Have a go at life drawing like Jack in the film *Titanic*. Did you know that the drawing done by Jack (Leonardo DiCaprio) in the film was actually done by the film's director James Cameron?!
- Create your own movie/cinema themed party invites.



Trood

Pop and top your own popcorn!

Did You Know?

In the 1920s when films started to become more popular, cinema houses had a 'No Food' policy. Cinema was seen in a similar light to the theatre and managers felt chewing and slurping was distasteful!

- Blindfolded, taste different flavours of popcorn or popcorn topped with different herbs and spices. See how many flavours you can guess correctly.
- Bake your own film reel sandwich biscuits.
- Decorate a cake to celebrate your favourite film or character. Why not see if your friends/family can guess which one you chose?
- Bake your own edible biscuit Oscars.
- Set up a pick 'n' mix stand at a charity event and raise money.

Why?

Originally vendors sold popcorn outside cinemas before they were allowed in. Following that they would roam the aisles selling their wares before the cinema managers realised there was money to be made from selling refreshments and confectionery.

- Cook and top your own hot dogs ready for your film night.
- Top your own nachos and whip up a dipping sauce in preparation for a movie night.
- Bake some clapper board biscuits for your favourite movie.
- In 1982 Reece's Pieces sales increased by 70% after E.T. was seen eating them in the movie *E.T. the Extra-Terrestrial*. Make or decorate something using Reece's Pieces or have a go at making your own.
- Create your own edible treats like those from Willy Wonka's factory in *Charlie* and the Chocolate Factory.
- Is cinema food healthy? Find out how much sugar/salt is in each treat and see if you can find or make a healthier alternative.
- Cook your own Ratatouille inspired by the film of the same name.

Games



- Name that film from a picture of a character or snippet of the trailer.
- See how many of the top 10 highest grossing films you can name.
- Have a game of Guess Who or the Name Game using film characters.

How?

Write the name of a film character on a sticky note and then stick it to someone else's head. They can then ask questions with only yes or no answers and must guess who/what they are from their answers. Take it in turns to ask questions and enjoy this game with friends/family or have multiple goes in pairs.

- Play a game of movie BINGO!
- Identify the characters/actors when their faces are mashed up. Create your own by cutting photos up and collaging them together.
- Hunt around for props in a movie scavenger hunt.

How?

You can theme your scavenger hunt on any movie you like and find either pictures of the items hidden around your space or the actual items. Here are some ideas for a Toy Story themed scavenger hunt: cowboy boots, a rocket, slinky, toy soldier, piggy bank, etc.

- Have a game of Would You Rather on a movie theme. Use our free resource to kick-start your game or give you some inspiration.
- Name the film from the quote.
- Play Movie Charades use our free resource to start you off or create your own ideas.
- One for large groups: split in to small groups, create freeze frames from your favourite films and guess which movie each group picked.
- Predict the winners: have a sweepstake and see if you can guess the winners of the Oscars or BAFTAs from the shortlists. You could play for sweets or win tickets to the cinema!
- Make your own game of Walk of Fame pairs, there are over 2700 names to choose from.
- Try a movie emoji quiz and guess the titles from the emojis.

Other



- Write/create your own silent movie to go with a favourite piece of music.
- Use different kinds of technology to make movies; from smart phones to camcorders how has the technology changed and how do the results differ?
- Take a step back in time and see how technology has changed since the film industry began. Why not see what old tech you can find in your own family?
- Direct your own film; Steven Spielberg's first film, *The Last Gunfight*, was a 9 minute movie on 8mm film, created at the age of 11: earning him his Photography merit badge in the Boy Scouts.
- Host your own movie night.
- Visit the cinema and watch a film.
- Take a trip to the National Science and Media Museum in Bradford.
- Host your own Oscars and give out your own awards. Why not give your edible Oscars made for your Food challenge?
- Run your own awards evening and give out some funny awards at the end of term or in celebration of a family birthday/event.
- Rewrite your favourite scene from a film. What could the alternative ending be? You decide!
- Who's on your walk of fame and why? Debate with friends/family. Your answers could be your own personal icons or celebrities you think should be recognised.
- Debate: What is the best movie of all time?
- Read a film script and see how it differs from a book.
- 🕵 Find out what information is on a clapperboard and what they're used for.
- There are so many people in the credits on films. Take a look at some of the jobs in the film industry and see how you could earn a career working on set.
- Have a go at creating your own props or take a look at how special effects are created.
- Visit a movie set or film studios like the Warner Bros. Studio Tour London.
