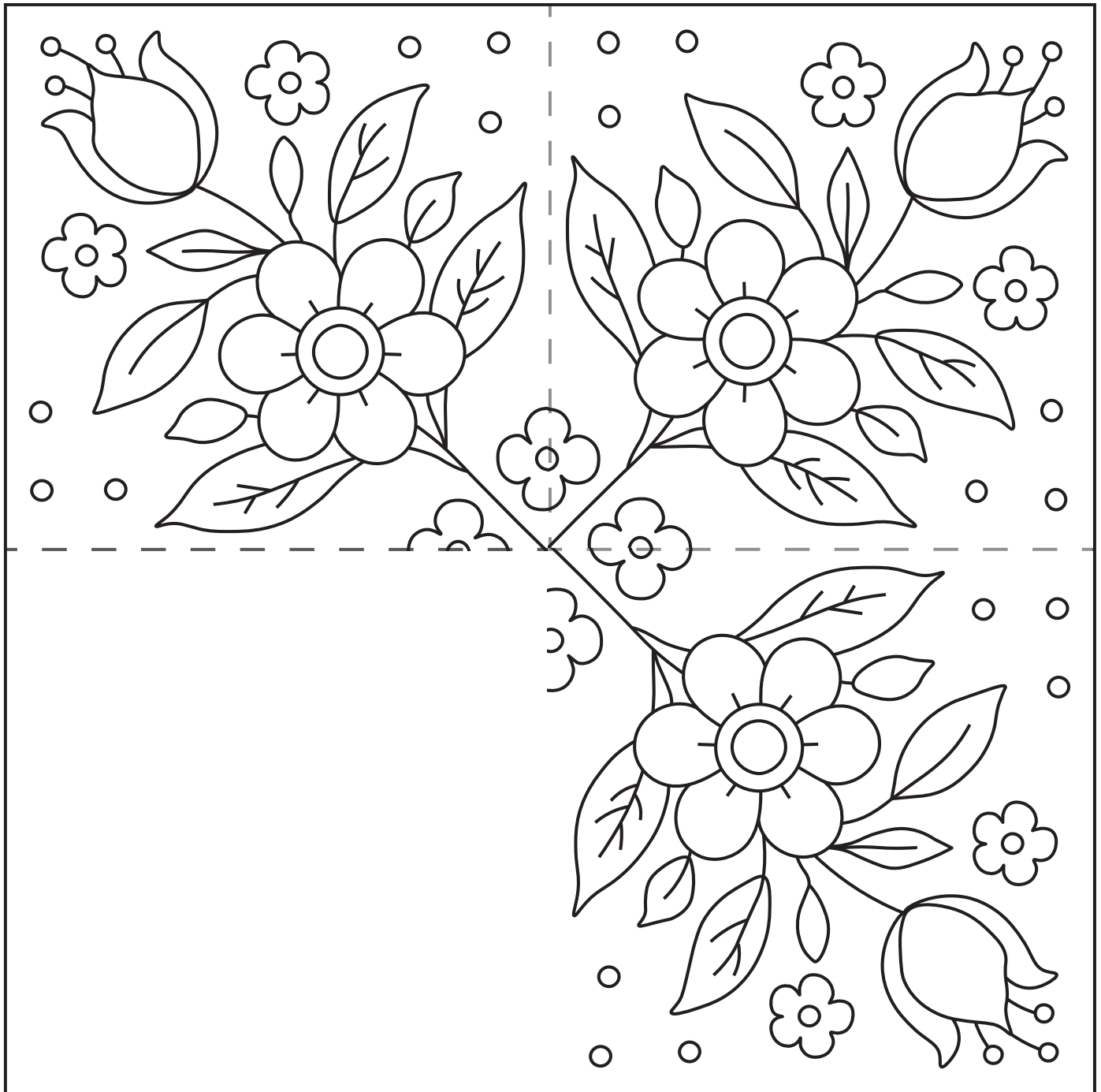


Copy and Colour a Turkish Tile
