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# HOW TO: Use Your Challenge Pack



This Challenge Pack has been divided into 4 sections: Craft, Food, Games and Other. In order to help you provide a balanced and varied programme for your young adventurers we recommend that the following number of activities are completed by each age group:

## TOP TIPS

- Adapt activities as necessary to meet your needs.
- Add your own activity ideas or develop them into projects.
- Use what you have; don't buy in lots of new materials/equipment.
- No need to send us evidence, responsible grown-ups decide when the badge has been earned.
- One challenge badge can take as long as you like; from a few hours to days or even a full term!

## Terms of Use

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# Craft

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- ★ Use a spinning wheel like the one from *Sleeping Beauty*, but try not to prick your finger on the spindle!
- ★ Make a set of fairy wings so that you can be the star of the next tale.
- ★ Decorate or make a crown to make yourself the king or queen of the castle.
- ★ Have a go at whittling to carve your own magic wand from a stick. You might need a grown up to help you with this if you haven't done it before.
- ★ Build the tallest tower for *Rapunzel* to let down her hair from. How could you decorate this to make it fit for a princess? Why not also make a dragon to keep her safe.
- ★ Decorate an egg that you would like a goose to lay for you every day.

## Why?

In *The Goose that Laid the Golden Eggs*, the cottager and his wife learn they should be patient and wait for their daily riches, rather than being greedy and demanding more.

- ★ Hold an *Emperor's New Clothes* fashion show to show off the clothes you can make from recycled materials.
- ★ Make an oil lamp like the one in *Ali Baba*. What would you wish for?
- ★ Craft your very own twirly whirly beanstalk from a paper plate. Have a look at our Pinterest board for some ideas.
- ★ Create character finger puppets or decorate wooden spoons to tell your favourite fairy tale.
- ★ Put together a set of story stones or story dice to create your own fairy tales.

## How?

Think about what you would need to generate to make your story. For example, characters, actions, problems or locations. What will happen at each point in your story? You can decorate stones and pull them from a bag, or use our Blank Dice Template resource to help you make a start.

- ★ Design a dress or outfit fit for a ball with *Cinderella* and *Prince Charming*.
- ★ Make or design a shoe like in *The Elves and the Shoemaker*.



# Food

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- ★ Whip up some toffee apples inspired by *Snow White*.
- ★ Learn how to cut an apple into a rose for the princess in *Beauty and the Beast*.
- ★ Bake a gingerbread house for *Hansel and Gretel*. You could use sweets to decorate your house like the witch does in the fairy tale.
- ★ Grow some 'magic beans' and see how high your beanstalks can reach into the clouds. Would *Jack* be able to climb them to reach the giant's castle?
- ★ In the style of *The Gingerbread Man*, bake your friends and family.
- ★ Prepare porridge for the *Three Bears*; then try different toppings and flavours until you find your favourite that is 'just right'.
- ★ Carve your own design into a pumpkin. *The Fairy Godmother* turns a pumpkin into a carriage to take *Cinderella* to the ball. What can you make from yours?

Here's an idea!

Take a look at our Pumpkin Challenge or for more pumpkin based activity ideas, or Pantomime Challenge for more fairy tale fun.

- ★ Decorate a cake inspired by your favourite fairy tale. Could the flavour or fillings inside also be themed, such as red velvet for *Little Red Riding Hood*?
- ★ Design and make a fairy tale castle occasion cake.
- ★ Have a go at baking your own banana bread.

Why?

In some versions of the *Little Red Riding Hood* story, she is walking through the woods to bring grape juice and banana bread to her Grandmother.

- ★ Make an edible book, or bake something in the shape of a book.
- ★ Stories are passed on verbally in layers. Make a mille-feuille and build a desert from many layers.
- ★ Make an edible image or story. Can your friends guess which fairy tale it was inspired by?
- ★ Cook a dish using green beans from *Jack and the Beanstalk*.



# Games

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- ★ Hold a tower competition to see how tall you can build *Rapunzel's* tower.
- ★ Play capture the flag or capture the princess but remember to keep your own castle safe throughout the competition.
- ★ Have a game of *Princess and the Pea*. The princess closes their eyes while the other participants pass a 'pea' behind their backs. Then the princess opens their eyes and the challenge is to work out who is sitting on the pea.
- ★ Challenge yourself to work out whose shoes *Puss in Boots* is wearing.

How?

Everybody takes off their shoes and mixes them up. Without everyone else seeing, *Puss in Boots* chooses a pair of shoes to wear, then take it in turns to decide who they belong to. With smaller groups, participants could bring extra shoes along so there are more to choose from, such as their favourite party shoes or walking boots.

- ★ *Rumpelstiltskin* spins straw into gold. Spin your lie into gold in a game of two truths and a lie.
- ★ Build houses from different materials like the *Three Little Pigs* and see whose will last the longest if a wolf comes to blow them down.
- ★ Play 'Sleeping Beauties' as a twist on the sleeping lions game.
- ★ "What big eyes you have!" Create a character from a set of adjectives and body parts. Why not make up a story for your character to be a part of?
- ★ What would your name be if you were a character in a fairy tale? Use our Fairy Tale Character Name Generator resource to help you.
- ★ "Once upon a time" dates back to the 14th Century. Write a story as a group where each person takes a turn to say one word.
- ★ Fairy tales are passed on by mouth. Play the telephone game and see how your message changes as it travels from person to person.
- ★ If you have a big group, why not have a game of 'What time is it Mr Wolf?' as a spin off from the *Little Red Riding Hood* tale.
- ★ Have a game of bowling with seven pins to represent *The Seven Dwarfs*. Why not use recycled plastic bottles and decorate them with materials of your choice to give each one its own character.



# Other

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- ★ Plait your hair like *Rapunzel*. Have a go at different types of plaits and if you don't have long enough hair, or don't fancy plaiting it, why not make a friendship bracelet instead.
- ★ Use your engineering skills to build a bridge for the *Three Billy Goats Gruff* to reach the grass on the other side of the stream.
- ★ Have a go at beanstalk climbing at your local climbing wall or activity centre.
- ★ Read or watch Roald Dahl's *Revolting Rhymes*.
- ★ Write your own fairy tale starting with 'once upon a time...' and think about how your characters might 'live happily ever after'.
- ★ Visit the world's most popular pantomime. Did you know there are over 700 versions of *Cinderella* around the world?
- ★ Act out your favourite fairy tale. Why not try making or using costumes or props to bring the story to life.
- ★ Read some traditional fairy tales and write a modern version.
- ★ The 'Goldilocks zone' is the habitable region around a star. Go stargazing and find out about constellations.
- ★ Create your own ending to a fairy tale. What if the characters don't live happily ever after, or what if there was a different moral to the story?
- ★ Visit a real life castle. Find out some facts about the castle's history, such as who lives there now or who used to live there in the past?
- ★ Turn a fairy tale into a news article or TV programme.
- ★ Why not grow your hair like *Rapunzel* and donate it to the Little Princess Trust. Did you know that we have a badge for both hair donors and fundraisers/supporters?
- ★ Watch an adaptation of a traditional fairy tale.
- ★ Visit a fairy tale castle or theme park and meet some of the characters from your favourite fairy tales.
- ★ Host a fairy tale themed party. Why not make an outfit for your craft activity and create a buffet of fairy tale themed snacks for your food challenge.
