Resource **Good Deed Dice**

You will need: Age 5-7:

To make your dice: • Template (see following pages) and take in turns to roll it each meeting.

Printer (colour optional)

Heavyweight paper/thin card

Scissors

· Glue

Pens to decorate (optional)

To use your dice:

· Good Deed Dice

· Your group/unit

Leaders make up one dice for the group

Age 7-11:

Leaders decide: make one for the group or one each using the template provided.

Age 11-18:

Everyone make a dice each and add your own good deeds using the blank template.

Instructions:

To make your good deed dice:

- 1. Print the following template in colour onto heavyweight paper or thin card.
- 2. Cut out along the dashed line.
- 3. If using the blank template-add our own good deeds, thinking about the quote from Baden-Powell.
- 4. Fold tabs to the back (away from the coloured side).
- 5. Fold along lines between colours, again folding to the back.
- 6. Glue the tabs to the back of their matching colour square.

To use your good deed dice, either:

- 1. Roll one dice each meeting and all complete the same good deed.
- 2. Take your dice home and roll it each day, completing the good deed.

All should: record your good deed/s via any method you choose.
