




HOW TO: Use Your Challenge Pack

- The Spanish fan, known as 'Pericon' in Spain is famously used as an accessory but more often known as a prop used in traditional dances such as flamenco. Make your own Spanish fan using coloured paper, glue and ribbon.
- Pablo Picasso was one of the most well known artists of all time and was in fact Spanish. Create your own masterpiece in the style of Picasso.
- Draw or paint a picture of a bull.

Why?

Bulls have played a very important part in religious ceremonies of Iberian tribes living in Spain for many years. They are also included throughout the year in Spain in a number of traditional events such as 'Running of the Bulls. This event is held annually from the 6th-14th July in Pamplona, Spain and involves six fighting bulls running from the Corrales de Santo Domingo to Pamplona's Plaza de Toros (a bullfight arena). Thousands of locals run alongside them over the 8 days dressed in white clothes with red bandanas tied around their necks and waists.

- Create a collage using red and yellow images to represent the Spanish flag.
- Craft a guitar using some old junk materials and use it to play along to some traditional flamenco music.
- Oid you know that the red carnation is Spain's national flower? Have a go at crocheting one using the tutorial on our 'Spain' Pinterest board.
- Decorate a Talavera tile.

What?

Talavera is a city in Spain known for it's imaginative ceramic patterns, especially it's colourful hand painted tiles. These tiles are unique because one is never the same as the other.

- Spain celebrate by hosting hundreds of festivals (or fiestas as they are known over there) throughout the year. Design a costume fit for a fiesta or try crafting your own festival mask.
- Imagine your dream tapas board and design it using the free resource on our website.
- Put together a model of La Sangrada Famila using recycled materials.

The Food



- Make a traditional Spanish paella.
- Churros are said to have originated in Spain. Have a go at making this deliciously sweet, cinnamon dessert. You could even melt some chocolate on the side to dip them in.
- Prepare a Spanish themed buffet for your family, friends or group.
- Assemble a plate of food using only red and yellow ingredients.

Here's an idea!

Why not make a healthy platter and organise the ingredients to look like the Spanish flag? For example you could use strawberries and raspberries for the red and pineapple and passion fruit for the yellow.

Eggs are used at both lunch and dinner in Spain but rarely at breakfast. Try a new recipe that includes eggs as a main ingredient for your evening meal. Why not count this towards your Eggcellent Challenge too?

Did you know?

It is very common for the Spanish to not eat their evening meal until very late in the evening, sometimes even as late as 10pm!

- World Croquette Day is celebrated in Spain on the 16th January every year. Try some for yourself by making them or ordering them in a restaurant.
- Spain is the top country in the world for producing olive oil. Make some olive oil chocolate mousse using the recipe on our 'Spain' Pinterest board.
- Whip up some tapas.

What?

Tapas are small plates of food in Spanish cuisine, traditionally eaten as an appetiser or snack but can be put together to make a full meal. Popular foods that are often included on a tapas platter are Patatas Bravas (spicy potatoes), Gambas al Ajillo (garlic shrimp), Spanish omelette, olives and chorizo.

- Try gazpacho, a Spanish soup made from tomatoes and vegetables that is served cold.
- Decorate cupcakes and arrange them to look like one of Don Quixote's windmills, an iconic scene in Castilla la Macha in Spain.

Games



- Have a game of 'Pato, pato, ganso'. This game works the same way as the popular playground game 'Duck, duck, goose'!
- Football is the most popular sport in Spain. Challenge your friends, family or group to a tournament.
- Test your language skills by using the Spanish vocabulary match game on our 'Spain' Pinterest board.
- Play a game of 'Chiviri Curarta'.

How?

'Chiviri Curarta' is a traditional Spanish game similar to Hide and Seek but to win players who hide must touch a base before the player who is seeking. Players must decide who is going to seek and what the base will be (e.g. a table, a wall, a chair etc). The seeker must count to 30 at the base and then go and try to find the hiders. The hiders must then run to the base before the seeker finds them. Whoever gets to the base first must shout 'chiviri cuarta por mi'!

- Draw or print some pictures of Spanish landmarks and use them to create your own Snap cards.
- Enjoy a traditional game of 'A pares y nones'.

How?

This game means 'evens and odds' in Spanish. To play you will need a group of players, the more the better. The players must then stand around in a circle, join hands, march and sing along to music (you could use a Spanish song). Then, the person in charge calls out a number (in Spanish) and the players must form a group of that number. Not only is this an exciting game to play with others but it also helps you to practice some Spanish numbers!

- Did you know that people in Spain take a short nap called a siesta in the early afternoon often after lunch? Shops and other businesses even close for this section of the day as a rest from the hot weather. Play a game of 'Sleeping Lions'.
- Learn some Spanish and have fun whilst playing some traditional Spanish hand clapping games.
- Take part in a game of 'El Repollo', a Spanish game that is similar to 'Hot Potato'.



- Many of us know the festive song 'Feliz Navidad' is Spanish for Merry Christmas. Learn how to sing 'Happy Birthday' in Spanish.
- The first ever modern novel 'Don Quixote' was said to be written in Spain. Have a go at writing your own short story.
- Read a travel guide or watch a documentary about Spain.
- Learn some Spanish nursery rhymes such as 'Los Pollitos' or 'Un Elefante se Balanceaba'.
- Research the history of bullfighting in Spain. You could find the information in a book from the library or online.
- Watch some videos of classic flamenco dancing and even take part in some yourself.
- Sing along to the song 'Veo Veo' a popular song for children in Spain. Can you find out what the song means in English?

Here's an idea!

Why not play the traditional Spanish game of the same name. Find the rules online and get some players together to have a go. You could even add this to your Games Challenge!

- Visit a local Spanish restaurant and try some of their traditional dishes.
- Hold a party to celebrate Las Fallas an annual festival held from the 14th -19th of March to symbolise the coming of Spring.
- Spain is known for it's markets where locals and tourists can enjoy Spanish cuisine as well going shopping for a wide selection of items. Visit a local market and enjoy as part of a day out with your family, friends or group.
- Discover some films set in Spain such as 'Ferdinand' (rated PG) which tells the story of a bull who is trained for bullfighting.
- The Sangrada Familia is one of the most famous Spanish landmarks. Find out more about how it was built.
- Spanish is the second most spoken language in the world. Learn some words in Spanish and try writing them down. You could start with 'Hello' or 'Goodbye' in preparation for a future trip to Spain.
