

**PAWPRINT
BADGES**

- ✚ St. George is said to have fought a dragon. Draw a picture of what you think the dragon looked like. Not so keen on drawing? Make a model of the dragon out of junk model materials or playdough instead.
- ✚ Put together a dancing hand print dragon! Head across to our 'St. George's Day' Pinterest board to find out how to make your own.
- ✚ Create a Shield Print (like butterfly printing!). Fold an A4 piece of paper in half length-ways, paint half of a shield on one side and press the painted half on top of the blank half to replicate your design and create a full shield.
- ✚ The English red rose is often linked with St. George's Day. Dry some red rose petals and find out how to transform them into a bowl of rose Potpourri to freshen up your home.
- ✚ Craft a paper/card rose. Why not attach a safety pin to the back to turn your rose into a brooch that you can wear on St. George's Day?



Food

- ✚ St. George was actually not even born in England... His life began in Cappadocia in Turkey. Cook a traditional Turkish dish of your choice.
- ✚ Have a go at making some dragon flame meringues. Check out our 'St. George's Day' board on Pinterest if you're not sure where to start.
- ✚ Prepare an edible shield out of goodies of your choice. Will you mark your shield with the red cross of England?
- ✚ Make some rose water from freshly dried rose petals.
- ✚ Many people celebrate St. George's Day by enjoying a traditional English meal. Cook a traditional English meal of your choice. Fish and Chips? Roast dinner? Afternoon Tea? The choice is yours!
- ✚ Test your icing skills by decorating cupcakes with buttercream roses. If you're not a fan of buttercream, why not assemble fondant roses instead?

- ✚ St. George's Day is celebrated on 23rd April each year. Find 23 red or white items around your house.
- ✚ Hold your own St. George's Day quiz. Think up your own quiz questions all about the Patron Saint of England. Why not use some of your food activity dishes to provide a feast for your quiz players?!
- ✚ Watch a St. George's parade and count how many roses or dragons you see.
- ✚ Take on the role of St. George in a 'hot seat' game. One player becomes the Patron Saint and the other players think of questions to ask him. How did he feel when fighting the dragon? What was it like becoming the Patron Saint of England? Swap roles for everyone to have a go at being St. George.
- ✚ Play a game of 'What's the time Mr Wolf', but instead of creeping up on the wolf, you have to tip-toe quietly towards the dragon and slay him before he gets you, just like St. George did!



Other

- ✚ Plan out your very own St. George's Day parade. Will you go all out with celebratory costumes? How about a traditional English feast?!
- ✚ England isn't the only country to recognise St. George as their Patron Saint. Find out which other countries and regions claim St. George as their patron.
- ✚ Print off a map and mark up all of the places that St. George is Patron Saint or find them all on a globe.
- ✚ Take a trip to Dragon Hill in Uffington, Berkshire. Why not learn of the legend of St. George and Dragon Hill whilst you're there?
- ✚ St. George was a Roman soldier. Discover more about Roman soldiers back in 300 AD and what St. George did in the Roman Army. Is it different to what the Roman soldiers of today have to do? Do they wear the same uniform?
- ✚ Have a go at Morris dancing; a dance often performed on St. George's Day.
