




## HOW TO: Use Your Challenge Pack

# PAWPRINT SBADGES

- Create a beautiful pink bouquet using coloured card or paper, inspired by Betty's wedding flowers.
- Thread craft bells onto string to make a jangly necklace that's perfect for a celebration! "Ring-a-ding ding"!
- Colour in your own party invitations using the free resource on our website.
- Craft Harry O'Hay and Betty O'Barley puppets using lollipop sticks or wooden spoons and decorate them with felt, fabric, googly eyes and buttons.

#### Here's an idea!

Why not put on a show for friends or family to tell the story of The Scarecrows' Wedding?

- Design a dream wedding collage using cut-outs from magazines, printed images, drawings, or any materials that spark your imagination.
- Draw a special wedding portrait of Harry and Betty to give them the perfect picture to remember their big day.
- Try your hand at ceramics and sculpt a jug, vase or cup.

#### Why?

In The Scarecrows' Wedding, Harry goes on an adventure to find water to keep their pink flower stalks wet. Once he had reached the "lovely wet pool", he realised he needed something to carry the water in; "A jug or a vase or a cup or a tin".

- Put together your own scarecrow outfit. Why not complete the look by collaging, painting or colouring a scarecrow mask?
- Turn a shoe-box on its side and create a mini 3D farm scene with scarecrows, animals, haystacks, and flowers using craft materials of your choice.
- Fold or cut out paper doves and decorate them with peaceful messages or kind wishes for Harry and Betty's wedding day.
- In the story, the geese each gave a feather to Harry and Betty to help create Betty's wedding dress. Draw a dress shape and use feathers to decorate and bring your design to life for a special party.
- Make a paper plate crab by folding a painted paper plate in half and adding pipe cleaner legs and cut out claws.





- "Pink flowerzzz? Pink flowerzzz?"
  Bake some pink flower-shaped biscuits inspired by Betty's wedding bouquet.
- Craft a harvest basket from paper, card, or recycled materials, then fill it with real or play-food treats like fruits, vegetables or edible flowers, just like Harry and Betty might gather from the farm.
- Mix up a fresh fruit punch. Perfect for a wedding toast!

#### How?

Slice up some strawberries, an orange, and a lemon, then pop them into a large jug. Add 500ml of pineapple juice, 300ml of orange juice, and 300ml of lemonade. Finish it off with a handful of fresh mint leaves and a generous scoop of ice. Give it a stir, pour into glasses, and raise a toast to Harry and Betty!

- Teamwork and cooperation are important themes in The Scarecrows' Wedding. Host a dinner party where each guest brings a different dish, just like all of the farm friends who helped make Harry and Betty's wedding so special. Together, you'll create a delicious feast that shows how everyone's unique contributions make the celebration even better.
- Make a list of all of the foods you would want to eat at a wedding or party.
- Make some edible haystacks.

#### How?

In a saucepan, gently melt 60g of butter with 120ml of honey or golden syrup over a low heat, stirring often to avoid burning. Once fully melted, remove from the heat and stir in 90g of breakfast cereal until everything is evenly coated. Spoon small piles of the mixture onto a baking tray lined with baking paper, shaping them into little 'haystacks'. Pop them in the fridge for about 30 minutes to set. Once firm, enjoy your delicious farm-inspired treat!

- Design a wedding cake! What flavour will you choose and how will you decorate to make it fit for a scarecrow celebration?
- Try making some edible wedding confetti using small pieces of rice paper, small pieces of dried fruit and sprinkles.
- "Harry loved Betty, and Betty loved Harry"
  Show somebody you love and care about them by cooking them their favourite meal or sweet treat.

# Games



- Put a ring on it. Holding a skewer in your mouth and, without using your hands, pick up as many rings as you can (these could be metal washers, nuts or ring shaped biscuits). This game is recommended for older adventurers.
- "So the snail and the scarecrow set off on their way, but the snail was so slow..." Take on the slow snail challenge by completing mini tasks as slowly as possible without stopping completely.

#### For Leaders!

Some suggested challenges could be walking from one end of the room to the other, performing your best dance moves or even just something as simple as giving someone a high five. The slowest (but steadiest) player wins each round!

- Join Harry and Betty on their quest to find everything on their wedding list by taking part in a Scarecrows' Wedding themed scavenger hunt using the free resource on our website.
- Create your own board game inspired by The Scarecrows' Wedding story.
- "The farmer came by with a frown on his face, And he made a new scarecrow to take Harry's place." Play Scarecrow Dress-Up Dash.

#### How?

Players split into two teams. Each team chooses one person to be the scarecrow. Place a pile of old clothes and accessories (e.g. hats, scarves, gloves, shirts, trousers etc) at the opposite end of the space. One at a time, players must run to the pile, grab one item of clothing, race back and dress their scarecrow. The first team to fully dress their scarecrow are the winners. Bonus points can be added if the team adds shredded paper or straw for hair and to stuff the sleeves!

- The crab in the story helped Harry and Betty by finding them a shell necklace. Take part in a crab walk relay where you can only walk sideways.
- One of the most important skills for being a good friend is learning to share, just like the animals did in the story when they each gave what they had to help Harry and Betty prepare for their wedding. Practice taking turns in a game or letting someone else have a go before you.
- Play a game of Duck, Duck, Goose.

- Read *The Scarecrows' Wedding* by Julia Donaldson and Axel Scheffler.
- "So they wrote down the Things they would Need on the Day"

  Make a list of all of the things you think you would need to remember for a wedding day or special party celebration.
- Watch the animated The Scarecrows' Wedding film airing on BBC One this Christmas 2025, and after on BBC iPlayer.
- Visit a local farm and feed the animals.
- Take a trip to the seaside and collect some shells to use to make your own necklace, just like the one the crab bought for Betty and Harry in the story.
- Plant some flowers to use in a future wedding bouquet.
- Make your own scarecrow at home or in the garden, using recycled materials and old clothes. What name will you give to yours?
- "I can sing lots of songs. I can dance, I can drive!
  I'm dashing! I'm daring! I'm cool as can be!"
  Make a list of the things you are good at. It could be dancing, helping others or making people laugh. Celebrate your talents and what makes you, you!
- Discuss the ways you can help others, just like the animals helped Harry and Betty prepare for their wedding.
- Have a go at putting on your own performance of The Scarecrow's Wedding for friends and family.
- Getting married is also known as 'tying the knot', learn some new knots or teach a new knot to a friend.
- "I can find you a field of pink flowerzzz!"

  Visit a local flower farm such as a lavender or sunflower field for a beautiful day out surrounded by the bright colours of nature.
- Some of the themes of the book are teamwork and co-operation. What do these things mean to you? What do you think it means to work as a team?
- Plan a party for a friend or member of your family. Make sure it is the best party yet, the party "thαt no one will ever forget"!
