

- Design your own rollercoaster; why not have a go at building it with recycled materials?
- Make a marble run (a rollercoaster for marbles). Can you create loops, twists and turns?
- Build your own carousel or Ferris wheel from materials of your choice.

Did You Know?

The first Ferris wheel was designed by George Washington Gale Ferris, Jr. for the World's Columbian Exposition in Chicago in 1893. Riesenrad, located inside Vienna's Prater amusement park, is the oldest operating Ferris wheel still in operation in the world and was originally constructed in 1897!!

- The world's tallest rollercoaster is Kingda Ka; located at Six Flags Great Adventure, New Jersey, USA. Reaching a whopping height of 139m, make a height chart and work out how tall you are and compare.
- Create your own firework picture using materials of your choice.

Why?

Although we don't know the exact figures as they're closely guarded, we do know that Disney is the second largest purchaser of explosives in the USA, with firework shows every night at Walt Disney World®!

- Design your own theme park (or pleasure gardens as they were known historically). Why not take inspiration from parks around the world such as Tivoli in Copenhagen which reportedly inspired Walt Disney.
- Create your own thrill experience such as a ghost train or haunted house.

 Decorate your home or meeting place and create some thrills of your own!
- Make and create your own side show. Many theme parks have smaller attractions such as tin can alleys, basketball challenges and hoopla.
- Expedition Everest in Disney's Animal Kingdom still holds its title of the most expensive rollercoaster in the world, at a cost of over \$100 million! The ride features a scale model of Mount Everest; build your own.
- Spinning teacups are a feature of many theme parks, make your own craft using an old teacup. Why not turn it in to a candle, a pin cushion or even an afternoon tea stand!

Food



- Make your own s'mores. Several versions can be found at theme parks across America but we reckon chocolate digestives with marshmallows will always top the charts!
- Fry your own tortilla chips.

Why?

Popularised by Rebecca Webb Carranza in the 1940s, the Doritos brand was invented at Disneyland! A restaurant named Casa de Fritos repurposed stale tortillas and they became so popular they were eventually sold nationally by Frito-Lay in 1966.

- Popcorn stands, candy floss machines and themed restaurants can all be found at theme parks. Create your own theme park food; why not create a new invention for your newly invented theme park?
- Build a roller toaster...a roller coaster from toast! Yes, you read that right. Get creative with toast and cocktail sticks to create your dream roller toaster!
- Make your own mouse-inspired theme park treats like those that can be found at the Disney parks. Take a look at our Pinterest board for some inspiration and ideas.
- Taste test different brands of bottled water and compare them with tap water; can you taste the difference?

Why?

The world's oldest operating theme park, Dyrehavsbakken (commonly known as Bakken) in Denmark was built at a natural spring in 1583 and still thrives today!

- Discover and grow some edible plants. At one point, all the greenery in Tommorrowland was edible as part of Walt Disney's vision for a self-sustaining world.
- Best sellers at theme parks continue to be hot dogs, pizza and nachos; make your own. Why not cook over a campfire or make your own nacho dips?
- Kennywood Amusement Park in America is famous for its deep-fried Oreos. Coated in batter and deep fried they make it on to many "try before you die" lists! Have a go at making your own at home.
- Looking for a slightly healthier treat? Granny's Apple Fries are a favourite at LEGOLAND. Made with Granny Smith apple slices and coated in cinnamon sugar, make your own and try them for yourself!

Games

PAWPRINT **BADGES

Carry eggs through an obstacle course or hold a basket of eggs whilst bouncing on a trampoline!

Why?

No, we've not gone mad! The world record for the most eggs retained whilst on a rollercoaster is 110, achieved by Özgür Tuna and his "co-pilot" Udo Baron at Europa-Park in Rust, Germany, on 21 June 2013. Try recreating this crazy record yourself or see how fast you can peel a boiled egg whilst bouncing for a less messy alternative!

- Have a water fight or create your own water flume obstacle course with slip 'n' slides. Take inspiration from log flumes and water parks near you!
- Lines and queues are part of the theme park experience. Play some games in lines that you could enjoy whilst queuing!

What?

There are loads of games you could play whilst waiting in line, from passing objects overhead and underneath to i-spy and A-Z games, the possibilities are endless. Why not invent your own game for queuing?

- Have a game or two (or even a full-blown tournament) of i-spy, would you rather or rock, paper, scissors; all of which make great queuing games!
- Play a trading game with LEGO. In 2015, LEGOLAND introduced their own currency so why not use those little blocks as a currency of your own. Trade blocks to build an object or compete to build the tallest tower you can.
- The fastest roller coaster in the world is the Formula Rossa at Ferrari World, Abu Dhabi which can reach speeds of over 60mph in 5 seconds! How fast can you run/hop/skip/jump?
- Build a virtual theme park in a computer game of your choice.
- Play a game or two of Meeple Land; a board game that is fun for all the family and gets you building your own theme park.
- Create or have a go on a coconut shy, basketball challenge or tin can alley; all of which can be found as amusements at theme parks.
- Match attractions to their corresponding theme park in a game of pairs.
- Use our Trump Cards Resource and make your own trump card game with different roller coasters. Rank them by height, speed, number of loops, etc.

Other



- Visit a theme park.
- Discover all the theme parks in your area/country and some fun facts about them. Maybe you could compare them and decide which one you'd like to visit most?
- Celebrate Roller Coaster Day on 16th August each year.
- Many theme parks began life as pleasure resorts which were popular for day trips or weekend holidays. Blackpool Pleasure Beach in England is one example; take a trip to the seaside and enjoy some fun in amusement arcades, get some thrills on rides and discover the origins of theme parks.
- The world's largest indoor water park is located in Germany and can accommodate up to 6,000 visitors per day. Visit a water park near you.
- The Smiler at Alton Towers, UK holds the world record for most track inversions. Try hanging upside down at an aerial yoga class (or similar).
- In the 1920s Cary Grant (the British-American actor) stilt walked at Coney Island's Steeplechase park, before he was famous. Try stilt walking.
- Host a themed evening or party based on your favourite ride, theme park or attraction. There are 1000s to choose from!
- Swing rides (or chair-o-planes) have long since been a feature at theme parks; visit your local park and have some fun on the swings. Fancy a bigger challenge? Try pioneering and build a swing or chair-o-plane of your own!
- Have a go on a virtual reality ride or motion simulator for a different theme park experience.
- Discover some fun facts or world records held by theme parks around the world.
- Enjoy Christmas all year round and create your own Santa Claus Land (one of the first theme parks which opened in 1946).
- World Fairs also had an influence on theme parks, featuring sights from across the globe and exhibiting new inventions. Host your own fair for your local area and invite businesses and individuals to have stands. Why not use your event to fundraise? Remember to check if you need special permissions or licenses first.
