




# HOW TO: Use Your Challenge Pack

# & Craft \*\*\*



- Create a water filter the Antarctic ice sheet represents around 90% of the world's ice and 80% of its fresh water!
- Build a working compass.

#### Why?

As Antarctica is the most Southerly point on the Earth, everything in Antarctica is North! West and East Antarctica are created by the prime meridian which runs through Greenwich, England at 0° longitude.

- Make a model volcano...from ice! Mount Erebus is one of two active volcanoes in Antarctica and features ice fumaroles/ice towers over steam vents.
- Create your own weather station to record the weather; there are around 80 research bases in Antarctica, run by around 30 countries.
- Have a go at ice carving to create an ice sculpture.
- Make a model from snow (real or artificial, it's your choice).
- Build an indoor igloo or den using recycled plastic bottles.
- Make a journal, create a diary or decorate a notebook to record your adventures.

#### Why?

There have been many Antarctic expeditions by many intrepid explorers. Probably the most famous of them all, Captain Robert Scott, detailed his race to the South Pole in his diaries which were later found after his death by Norwegian Tryggve Gran. Gran kept his own diaries in which he detailed the discovery of Scott's frozen body.

- Antarctica holds a few awards as the highest, driest, windiest, coldest and iciest continent on the planet. Invent your own awards for friends and family with some 'est' words, i.e. funniest, cheekiest, loudest, etc.
- Grow your own salt crystal snowflakes.
- Almost 75% of the world's Killer Whales live in Antarctica and Blue, Humpback, Minke and other whales can also be found in Antarctic waters. Make a craft of your choice on a whale theme and have a whale of a time!
- Make your own wax seal stamp; 6 of 35 seal species live in Antarctica!

- Make your own lava bombs from chocolate truffle, like the flying blobs of lava that fly out of Mount Erebus!
- Mix up your own blood red mocktails and discover why the water that flows at Blood Falls on the Taylor Glacier is red.

#### Here's an idea!

Why not serve your blood red mocktails in ice glasses for a truly Antarctic beverage OR just get creative with red fruit juices and add some ice cubes!

- Deep Lake in Antarctica is so salty that it can't freeze. Freeze your own ice cubes or create a frozen dessert, just make sure if you do that you don't add salt instead of sugar!!
- Bake your own floating meringue icebergs.

#### Why?

In 2000, a chunk the size of Connecticut broke off the Ross Ice Shelf. Did you know that when an iceberg breaks off the ice shelf it's known as 'calving'.

- Antarctica is a frozen desert (often mis-spelled as dessert)...have a go at freezing your own frozen dessert of choice!
- Bake an Aurora Australis cake with swirls of bright colour through the batter to make beautiful hidden delights.
- Take a look at the Antarctic food web; can you demonstrate it in a fun/edible way, say...through biscuits?
- Make yourself some edible emperor penguin popsicles (try saying that five times fast!) using bananas dipped in chocolate.
- Build and use a solar oven to cook; the snow in Antarctica reflects the light so effectively that sunburn is often an issue for visitors.
- 60-90% of the world's fresh water is locked in the Antarctic ice sheet which covers around 5.4million square miles (14 million km²). Learn how to filter or distill water to purify it.
- The majority of the Antarctic continent sits south of the Antarctic Circle, the southern most circle of latitude. Make your own Antarctic Circle iced, ring doughnuts. Why not decorate them with little penguins or icebergs?

- Complete an obstacle course in the dark. Antarctica has six months of darkness (winter) and six months of daylight (summer) because of the Earth's axis. For some days in the winter the sun does not rise so there is 24-hour darkness.
- Can you jump the height of a penguin? Emperor penguins can reach up to 120cm in height, how high can you jump?
- Almost all of Antarctica is south of the Arctic Circle. Play some circle games in a group.
- Race to melt the ice and free trapped toys/penguins.
- Hold you own waddle races; waddle like a penguin holding a ball (egg) on the top of your feet to stop it touching the ice.
- Race to get dressed for the desert.

#### How?

In 2 teams, relay race to gather clothing items for a hot and cold desert. When we think of deserts, many of us only ever think of hot, sandy places and we never think of places like Antarctica. Antarctica is a frozen desert with an average rainfall of less than 10cm per year...Just think how long it's taken for the ice to get as thick as it is!!

- Antarctica is the windiest place on Earth! Race to get a ball through an obstacle course with desk fans and hair driers trying to blow you off course!
- Have a snowball fight with newspaper snowballs or use your 'snowballs' to knock down tin cans in a tin can alley.
- Play musical icebergs.

#### What?

Make a range of icebergs either from paper cut-outs or using furniture. Just like musical chairs; when the music stops, find an iceberg (you can share if it's big enough). Anyone without an iceberg is out. When the music starts again, icebergs melt away (get removed from the game) to make it harder.

- Build the tallest tower of ice cubes that you can in 1 minute.
- How fast can you melt an ice cube? Time yourself and compete with friends.
- Have a game of ice hockey on a baking tray using a button and lolly sticks.

# Other:



- Complete an experiment to see the impact of land vs. sea ice on rising sea levels. Which affects it more? Why is this?
- In 1959 the Antarctic treaty was signed, designating Antarctica as a reserve for peace and science. Create your own treaty as a family or group. What will your core values be and how can you work to achieve them?
- Plot a route up to 4 miles and walk, run, cycle, swim the distance. The Antarctic ice sheet is up to 4 miles thick in some areas, this activity will help you visualise this.
- In 1979 Emile Marco Palma was the first human to be born on Antarctica and since then there have only been 10 others. Find out where you were born and if you can, take a trip there.
- Hold a meeting or event in the dark to experience Antarctic winter. There are often rope lines between buildings which you are required to hold on to and follow to the next entrance. Maybe you could create a route to follow?
- The coldest temperature on earth was recorded in Antarctica. Record the temperature where you live and see how low the temperatures fall.
- Discover one or more Antarctic expeditions. Why not complete your Earnest Shackleton badge?
- Every year around 40,000 tourists visit Antarctica. Do a role play and act out what you think a visit might be like. What will you see? How will it feel?
- Antarctica is the highest continent with much of the landscape sitting at more than 3,000 metres above sea level. Visit the highest point near you and see how high you are, then compare.
- Keep a diary for a fixed amount of time, maybe over a holiday or for a month. What will you record and include? Why not discover and read the diaries from an Antarctic expedition and take inspiration from them?
- Scientists believe than 40-50 million years ago Antarctica experienced a climate much like Melbourne, Australia. Discover what the climate and life is like there, what kind of animals and plant life exist, what would you need to wear or think about on a visit?
- Explore more and find out your own fun facts about Antarctica and share them in an interesting way. Why not tag us in your facts on social media?
