

During your exhilarating journey, you will


- Sail along a 95-mile stretch of the Devon and Dorset coastline, learning about the fascinating things you may encounter.






HOW TO: Use Your Challenge Pack

PAWPRINT **BADGES

- Create your own fossils and make plaster casts of objects.
- Scelidosaurus (the dinosaur on your badge) was an armoured dinosaur. Have a go at making your own dinosaur armour.
- You can see dinosaur footprints at Keates Quarry in Swanage. Make a set of dinosaur footprints from paper and create your own dino trail.
- Make model dinosaur bones or models of fossils using materials of your choice. Why not take a trip to see some specimens for real and use them as inspiration.

What?

Salt dough is fun for all ages and is super simple to make, why not mix up a batch for your models or get creative with play-dough or other modeling materials?

- Papier-mâché a dinosaur egg and decorate it however you like using materials of your choice. Don't fancy papier-mâché? Why not decorate an egg shaped stone or an egg shell?
- Echinoderms are the 'stars' of the marine world and you can find many beautiful examples of intricately-patterned fossils along the Jurassic coast. Create your own patterned echinoderm using our Five Star Fossil resource.
- Collage a habitat from photos or magazines. Play with scale and mix up your plants to create a new habitat for dinosaur toys or your own illustrations.

Why?

The Jurassic Coast looks very different now to how it would have been when dinosaurs roamed Britain; from the baking deserts of the Triassic period (252 - 201 million years ago), through the tropical sea of the Jurassic period (201 - 145 million years ago) and into the forests and swamps of the Cretaceous period (145 - 66 million years ago).

- Build your own model of the Jurassic Coast and explore the landscape of this dramatic coastline.
- Plant a terrarium with ferns to create your own Jurassic habitat at home.
- Make a set of dinosaur feet for your Dino Dash game.
- Discover some of the fossils you can find around the country and then create your own amazing creatures, either as a model, draw or collage.

FOOG



- Bake some dinosaur feet biscuits or savoury bites to make your own edible dinosaur trails like the ones that can be found at Keates Quarry.
- You've heard of fondant fancies, now make your own fossil fancies! Fancy petit fours that look like fossils.
- Make your own dino-s'mores! Ok, so they're just s'mores but maybe you can enjoy them after a day of fossil hunting?
- Go edible fossil hunting.

How?

Create your own fossils from fondant or chocolate and hide them in edible soil made from blended cream-filled chocolate biscuits.

- The Scelidosaurus was a herbivore, as were many of the dinosaurs that inhabited the Jurassic Coast. Make a vegan dish, suitable for a herbivore.
- Baryonyx had a 31cm claw on their thumb which they used to hook fish from the water. Grab a cocktail stick to skewer your own fish bites.
- Cook a fish recipe, suitable for a Baryonyx.
- Do an experiment with bread and jelly sweets to see how fossils are formed. Check out our Pinterest board for some ideas.
- Bake your own dinosaur bone bread sticks and enjoy with a Jurassic dip!
- Set a Jurassic jelly.

How?

Set dinosaur toys in a layered jelly to show how the animals, plants and insects became trapped to form fossils. Why not use different colours of jelly to show the different rock types and periods of the Jurassic Coast's history?

- Roll some Ammonite swirls, will you make yours savoury or sweet? Simply spread your chosen fillings on a layer of puff pastry before rolling up to form a sausage and slicing to reveal Ammonite-like swirls.
- Build a layered cake or dessert to show the different periods of the Jurassic Coast. Can you build different flavours in to your cake/dessert to reflect the climate of the location at the time? What colours will you use? Share your desserts with us on socials...we love seeing your photos!

Games



- Diplodocus were around 27 metres in length. Take a trip to your nearest park and see how long it would take you to walk, run, crawl and plod (like a dinosaur) that distance.
- Baryonyx had a hooked claw to hook fish, have a go at your own fishing game using our free resource.
- Mary Anning is believed to have inspired the tongue twister, *She Sells Sea Shells*. Try saying it as fast as you can. How do your skills compare to your friends and family?

What?

She sells seashells on the seashore, the shells she sells are seashells, I'm sure. For if she sells seashells on the seashore, then I'm sure the shells she sells are seashells for sure!

- Create your own Jurassic trump card game using our free resource. Do your research and compare dinosaurs that lived on the Jurassic Coast. How will you rate them?
- How fast can you uncover the fossils in a Dino-Dig?

What?

Either set some toys in a salt-dough style mix or hide them in a bucket of dirt. Smash your way into your 'rocks' to find the dinosaur toys as fast as you can or dig them out brantub style. Want a more messy alternative? Hide the toys in edible dirt and use only your mouth/face to dig those dinos out!

- Play a wide-game in an open space and have a game of Jurassic Park! Find the dinosaurs that have escaped and hidden themselves around your local park/garden or green space.
- Go on a dinosaur egg hunt or take part in a fossil hunting scavenger hunt to find all the tools and equipment you'll need to head off on your own paleontologist adventure!
- Dinosaur, Dinosaur, Where's Your Egg? Have a game of Queen's Keys but this time it's a blindfolded mama-dino in the centre protecting her eggs. Creep around the outside of the circle, grab the eggs and get back to your spot without getting caught!
- Have a Jurassic jump and test your agility. Set out different coloured dinosaur feet to make a jumping, hopping, twisting trail. Check out our Pinterest board for some ideas.

Other



- The Jurassic Coast's climate has transformed over time. Find out what it was like in the Jurassic period and see where in the world has a comparable climate. Take a look and see what life is like there and what animals and plants thrive in that climate.
- During the Jurassic period the Jurassic Coast would have been a forest of ferns, grow and care for a fern.
- Take a trip and discover the Jurassic Coast for yourself.
- Visit a museum and see some fossils in real life.
- Take a trip to see some dinosaur bones.
- Enjoy some dino-snores and have a dinosaur/Jurassic themed sleepover.
- There are around 21 types of dinosaur found in England, find out more about them. Why not share your discoveries with friends and family in an interactive way.
- The Jurassic Coast is the first (and currently, only) natural UNESCO World Heritage Site in England and was inscribed in 2001. Plot where the coast is on a map and find out who UNESCO are. Are there any other World Heritage Sites near you?
- Triassic, Jurassic and Cretaceous periods can be observed along the Jurassic Coast. Make a timeline of these periods and include the animals that would have lived during these times.
- Experiment and see which kind of soil is best for forming cast fossils. Press objects into trays of sand, soil and a sand/soil mix. Gently remove the objects and fill any void left with plaster of Paris to create your 'cast fossil'. Leave the plaster to set and then compare your fossils to see which soil was best.
- Watch Jurassic Park or another Jurassic themed film/documentary.
- Check out all the tools for fossil hunting and what each one is used for. Head to discoveringfossils.co.uk/equipment for a good list.
- Creatures like lobsters haven't changed for over 500 millions year. Check out some other animals that haven't changed so much.
- Dacentrurus was the first Stegosaur ever discovered (characterised by plates along their spine). Decorate a dino-plate for your next dino-dinner!
