




HOW TO: Use Your Challenge Pack

PAWPRINT **BADGES

- Make a dog toy for your furry friend.
- Studies have shown that dogs align themselves with the Earth's magnetic field before having a poo, preferring to face North or South. Make a compass using a magnet.
- Create some fingerprint/nose print art.

Why?

A dog's nose print is as unique to them as fingerprints are to humans!

- Stitch a bow tie for your dog's collar.
- Make a sensory jar.

Why?

Dogs are often used as therapy for people in hospitals, nursing homes, schools, libraries, hospices and/or disaster areas along with being assistance pets for those with anxiety, autism and sensory needs.

- Dogs are not colourblind (as previously thought) they see in black and white with blue and yellow tones too. Have a go at colour mixing.
- Create your own communication device. Dogs were used in WW1 to lay phone lines in the trenches. Why not make a cup and string phone?
- Make your own decorations for a birthday party and celebrate your furry friend or another family member's birthday!
- Dogs are commonly used as mascots for sports teams and also regiments in the armed forces. Design your own canine mascot.
- The oldest breed of dog is the Saluki which comes from Egypt as early as 329BC. Try writing in Egyptian hieroglyphs.
- Knot a dog collar using macrame and/or para-cord. Use a cloth measuring tape to check the size and add 1-2 inches (3-5cm) to the length to make sure it's not too tight!
- Design an outfit for a canine friend.
- Complete another canine themed craft of your choice and share it with us on our social media.

T Food



- Decorate mini chocolate rolls or add ears and legs to chocolate bars to make them look like little Dachshunds.
- Identify different foods while blindfolded. Make it more challenging and see if you can identify different flavours of dog food by their smell.

Why?

Dogs sense of smell is 10,000 times stronger than that of humans!

- Create your own dog friendly treats or food. Not got a pet? We're sure the local kennels or dog shelter would be grateful of some homemade treats!
- Puppies have 28 teeth and adults 42. Find out about the different 'jobs' that teeth are designed for and how to look after yours and your pets teeth.
- Design a meal plan for the week keeping a good balance of nutrients. Dogs are omnivores so eat meat, grain and vegetables.
- Dogs can be trained to sense allergies and allergic reactions. Find out about different food allergies and make a recipe suitable for someone with an allergy of your choice.
- Make/decorate a birthday cake to help Alfie celebrate his birthday. You could make a cake suitable for humans or dogs.
- The Lagotto Romagnolo is a breed of dog from Italy that is often used to sniff out truffle. Find out what truffle is and if you can try some.
- Make and top your own hot dogs.
- Bake some bread rolls shaped like dog bones...why not use them as hot dog buns?
- Collect dog food and donate it to your local animal rescue centre or dogs home.
- Obesity is the top health problem for dogs. Find out which human foods are safe for dogs to eat and make a meal that would be suitable for sharing with your canine friend.
- Dog food manufacture has come under the spotlight in recent years. Find out how dog food is made and how we can check that the food we buy is good for our pets.

Games



- Dogs are highly sociable. Play some team games with friends or family either in real life or virtually.
- Puppies love to play hide and seek; play a game yourself.
- Play a game of sleeping puppies (sleeping lions to you and me)!

Why?

Puppies can sleep for 18-20 hours a day when they're little and growing... we know! It sounds amazing doesn't it?!

- Perky eared breeds hear better than those with floppy ears. Test your listening skills with a game of queen's keys or Chinese whispers.
- Play a game of higher/lower guessing the weight of different dog breeds.

Did You Know?

The heaviest breed is a Mastiff which can weigh up to 200lbs (90.7kgs) and the lightest dog on record is a Chihuahua weighing in at 1.4lbs (0.6kgs)!

- Assistance dogs are bred and trained to help people with certain disabilities. One of these is visual impairment/blindness. Have a go at completing an obstacle course or daily tasks blindfolded and then try again with assistance from someone else describing.
- Decorate a flying disk or have a go at a game of Frisbee®.

Why?

Disc Dog is a recognised dog sport. In competitions, dogs and their human flying disc throwers compete in events such as distance and freestyle catching.

- Pin the tail on the puppy (a photo/drawing, not the real thing!) How close can you get?
- Have a go at a picture quiz of famous dogs both real and fictional, how many can you guess correctly?
- Sled dogs are used to pull sleds in colder climates. Build your own sled and have a race.
- Greyhounds can run up to 44mph, host your own sprint races and see how fast you can run.

Other



- Find out where different breed names come from and find them on a map. i.e. Where is Labrador located?
- Take a colour blindness test. Dogs are only red/green colourblind and not completely colourblind as originally thought.
- Did you know that you can get different coloured puppies in the same litter, even from the same coloured parents. This is similar to eye and hair colour in humans; find out how and why this happens and investigate dominant and recessive genes.
- Learn about dog body language and how to recognise when your furry friends are happy, scared, excited and tired.
- Stroking dogs releases oxytocin, a "feel good" hormone. Do something which makes you feel happy.
- Have a Guide Dog or other assistance dog visit your group and find out more about how assistance dogs can help people with different disabilities and autism. Why not count this towards your SENSES badges too?
- Find out about the different jobs dogs can do and share your findings in an interesting way.
- Newfoundland dogs are trained for water rescue; learn some lifeguarding/ lifesaving skills for when you're at the swimming pool or near open water.
- Watch a dog themed film... there must be 101 to choose from! Pun intended.
- Visit your local dogs home or shelter, find out about their work and how you can help them.
- Sniffer dogs are used in airports and at borders to sniff out illegal substances, money and firearms. Learn about different illegal substances and the dangers they pose.
- Have a Pets as Therapy dog visit you and find out more about their work. Visit them online at: www.petsastherapy.org
- Find out about some famous or hero dogs.
- Discover the role of puppy foster families who look after assistance puppies whilst they are learning and training. Could you be a foster family?
