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Craft

- * Make a journey stick whilst out on a walk.

How?

Gather special objects you find on your walk such as a piece of wool hooked on a fence, or a fallen autumn leaf. Make sure you 'leave rocks, stone, plants and trees as you find them' and 'do not cause damage or disturbance'. Tie your special objects to your stick with string. Then at the end of your journey, share the aspects of your stick with your family or group and explain why you added those specific items to your stick.

- * Create your own posters, signs and signals to help spread the messages of Respect, Protect, Enjoy.
- * Design 'bag it bin it' signs to remind dog walkers to bin their dogs waste. Create your own puns and funny tag lines to help you remember the countryside code. "Any bin will do for your dog's do do".
- * Take your litter home and make a collage out of the rubbish and wrappers you have collected.
- * Create a photo album or collage of photos from your adventures. When you look back on the memories you made, you'll remember how much you enjoyed your visit and had fun.
- * Choose one aspect of the countryside code to represent artistically in any way you choose. How would you show 'always keep dogs under control and in sight' or 'care for nature – do not cause damage or disturbance'?
- * Create a simple first aid kit to keep you safe whilst out and about. You never know when you, or a stranger, might need it! Fill out our free downloadable 'Emergency Card' resource to keep with you in case of an emergency.
- * Make an identification booklet for flora you find whilst enjoying parks, waterways, coasts and countrysides. Fill your booklet with drawings, photos or leaf rubbings to help you, and others, identify flora you find on your next walk. Remember to 'care for nature – do not cause damage or disturbance'. Can you find and identify an oak leaf, a daisy, a silver birch leaf, a buttercup, a sycamore leaf, and a primrose?
- * Take time to stop and create a picture or painting of something during your walk to make a special memory.
- * Gather sticks and twigs that are already on the floor and build a bug hotel using natural materials on your walk to help care for nature.



Food

- * Pack a handy snack to enjoy on your adventure out. Check out our 'Countryside Code' board on Pinterest for some healthy snack recipes and no-cook backpacking recipes that you can take with you on your walks.
- * Make an edible countryside landscape using ingredients of your choice.
- * Create an eco-friendly packed lunch where you take all of your recyclable packing home and use it again, or recycle it.
- * Put together some edible stiles using chocolate fingers or long, thin biscuits. Why not use them on your edible landscape?
- * 'Do not light fires and only have BBQs where signs say you can'. Find out where BBQs are allowed in the area you're visiting and enjoy a BBQ safely.
- * Whilst out walking, identify different foods and crops in the countryside. Would you recognise wheat or wild garlic on your adventures? Download our 'From Farm to Food' resource to see how crops are transformed into food!
- * Make an edible Countryside code logo using ingredients of your choice. Take this opportunity to discuss the countryside code and how to respect everyone, protect the environment and enjoy the outdoors.
- * Make your own chocolate poops!

How?

Make a batch of chocolate dough and mould it to look like different poop from a variety of animals, then bake it in the oven. Use your fab-poo-lous sculptures to help you identify which creatures have been in that area. For an extra giggle, why not bag up your chocolate dog poos in little bags and gift them to people to help them remember the 'bag it bin it' message? If your dog does a poop, don't forget to bag it and bin it!

- * Make biscuit signs from the countryside code, discussing what each arrow means and why they're important. Decorate them into the right shapes and colours for the arrows in the code.
- * Enjoy a picnic out in the countryside! Take food, drinks, blankets and pillows for a comfy countryside picnic. Remember to take all of your litter home with you after you finish and leave no trace of your visit.
- * Mix together your own trail mix full of your favourite nuts and dried fruit. Head across to our 'Countryside Code' board on Pinterest for some tasty trail mix inspiration. Why not take your trail mix with you on a National Trail walk? Visit www.nationaltrail.co.uk/ to find trails near you.



Games

- * Hold a litter picking competition with adult supervision. Use rubber gloves and litter pickers for cleanliness. Don't forget to take bin bags with you and bring the litter home to dispose of correctly (e.g. recycle plastics).
- * Can you remember what each countryside code sign means? Download our free 'Countryside Code Signs and Symbols' resource from the website to take with you on your adventures or use them to play a memory game, where each player picks a symbol, guesses what it means and then turns it over to see if they're right.
- * Put together your own waymarking rights of way quiz.
- * 4 corners 4 symbols. All countryside code arrows are printed onto paper and stuck up in each 4 corners of the room, so that each corner represents one of the four rights of way. Whenever the leader shouts 'footpath', 'bridleway', 'restricted byway' or 'byway open to all traffic', the players must run to the correct colour arrow/corner.
- * Download and print our free 'Spot the Signs' resource and circle all of the mistakes in the scenery/where the countryside code hasn't been followed (e.g. gates left open, dog poo not picked up, feeding livestock, fires, etc.).
- * 'Take your litter home – leave no trace of your visit'. Set up a game in your home where litter is placed around each room and players must enter the space to pick up their litter, then exit without leaving a trace, so that it's like they were never there!
- * Play a twist on the classic 'Mouse Trap' sports game. 'Walkers' make their way through the grid (lines of people holding out their arms to make pathways). Whilst walking, the grid players change direction on the spot, blocking access to gateways and driveways. This will help children to understand how frustrating it is when someone/something blocks your path!
- * Set out a scavenger hunt where a parent or leader gives the player directions to the treasure using only the correct arrows. For example, the player knows to go right because they've been given a yellow arrow, and the only route that is a footpath is the route on their right! Use the correct arrows from the waymarking rights of way document.
- * Newspaper islands. Learn how to 'share the space and work together' (just like in the countryside code) by squeezing the correct number of players onto the newspaper islands dotted around the room. Throughout the game, the leader will call out the number of people that need to fit onto each newspaper island.



Other

- * Plan a walking route to follow in the countryside, a park, along the coast or by waterways. Consider the weather, the distance, how long the walk might take you, and what essential items you might need for a safe walk.
- * Say hello to the people you pass on your adventures out and about. It'll brighten your day and theirs!
- * Plan an activity for someone else to complete on a walk.
- * Learn to say hello in different languages or dialects depending on the place you're visiting. For example, learn how to greet people in Welsh if visiting Bannau Brycheiniog!
- * Invite a local dog trainer into your unit/school to discuss how to train your dog to behave in the countryside.
- * Take part in a beach clean-up to help care for the environment.
- * Learn how to read maps (including the map key) and know where the footpaths are.
- * Find out how best to check the weather before heading out on your adventures.
- * Photocopy a map and mark key features onto it whilst you're walking. Mark where the dog waste bins are, the picnic areas, benches, toilets, car parks, and where gates should be closed, etc. Not only will this help you remember but it could help other visitors too!
- * Find a new footpath to walk and identify features or things to do along the route.
- * Discover the different types of stile, gates and other types of access point available within the countryside.
- * Visit a local riding centre and organise or take part in a horse hack. Whilst you're there, why not learn where the bridleways are and how to care for the horses too?
- * Take a photo in an iconic spot and re-visit that same spot in every season of the year – it's a great way to make memories!
- * Explore rock pools and return any living beasts to where you found them, taking care as you do so.
