



The Journey





-  The Sydney Opera House is one of the most iconic buildings in the world. Design your own building with innovative shapes or materials.
-  Build a bridge from recycled materials. Why not try making an arch bridge like the Sydney Harbour Bridge?
-  Sew, knit or crochet your own pouch to keep something special in.

Why?

Australia is home to lots of different animals who carry their young in pouches. When marsupials are born, they still have lots of growing to do but they can use their sharp claws to climb into their mother's pouch to drink their milk and continue developing.

-  Create a mask of your favourite Australian animal.
-  The platypus is often described as a 'hodgepodge' of other species because it has a bill and webbed feet like a duck, with the body and fur of an otter but the tail of a beaver. Collage your own hodgepodge animal.
-  Have a go at Aboriginal artwork by trying traditional dot painting method.
-  Create your own clap sticks from some sticks or paint stirrers. These are a traditional percussion instrument used in Aboriginal music alongside drums and didgeridoos. Some clap sticks are filled so can also be used as shakers.
-  Make or decorate a boomerang.
-  The Great Barrier Reef is losing its colour due to coral bleaching caused by the rising sea temperatures. Restore some brightness to the world with a colourful craft.

Here's an idea!

Why not use this as an opportunity to raise awareness of the impacts of climate change and how we can change our behaviour to reduce consequences like coral bleaching.

-  Make your own snappy crocodile using split pins or clothes pegs.
-  Assemble your own cork hat to keep the flies out of your face when you go camping. Though less common than the stereotype suggests, these hats were used by English settlers in the Outback.
-  Recycle some toilet roll tubes or paper plates into native Australian birds, such as cockatoos or kookaburras.

 Fairy bread is often served at children's birthday parties or eaten as a snack in Australia. Prepare your own using your favourite sprinkles.

 Make a pavlova.

Why?

There is some debate about whether the pavlova was invented in Australia or New Zealand, but either way it is a popular treat enjoyed by Australians.

 "Slip a shrimp on the barbie" and have some foodie fun in the sun with a barbecue. Why not try having a slice of beetroot in your burger which is another Aussie custom.

 Love it or hate it? Try vegetable and yeast extract on toast or in a sandwich.

 Enjoy some smashed avocado on toast for an Australian breakfast. To take this further, try some different variations like poached eggs or even pesto.

 Bake some Anzac biscuits. Military wives would make these for the Australian and New Zealand Army Corps (ANZAC) in World War One because they were cheap and long lasting. Now they are traditionally made on ANZAC day to commemorate the fallen soldiers.

 Taste some bush tucker like witchetty grub. These foods are eaten by Indigenous Australians and have lots of nutritional benefits.

 Make damper bread from salt, flour and water and cook over a campfire.

 Hold an Australian themed buffet with some of the other ideas on this page.

 Meat pies are a popular take away snack and come with a variety of fillings such as onions and cheese, or minced meat. Try following an Australian recipe and find out which filling is your favourite.

 Whip up an ice cream cake to cool down in the Australian heat.

 Bake an upside down cake to flip on your travels "Down Under".

 Australian singer and actress Kylie Minogue follows the Paleo diet of unprocessed foods which includes lots of fruits and vegetables. Fix up a fruit salad or a meal with lots of veggies.

 Decorate biscuits or cupcakes to look like the Australian flag.

-  Have a kangaroo bouncing race.
-  How high can you jump? How fast can you run? How far can you swim? Hold a Cassowary competition or complete a triathlon.

Why?

The Australian Southern Cassowary is a modern dinosaur that can jump 1.5 meters high, run up to 50 kilometers per hour through the forest and swim across wide rivers or sea.

-  Learn how to throw a boomerang and see who can throw one the furthest.
-  Don't get stuck between Ayers Rock and a hard place. Have a game of hypotheticals to practice making hard decisions.
-  The capital city of Australia is Canberra. However there is a common misconception that Sydney is the capital, though it never has been. Take part in a quiz about Australia to see how many misconceptions you can correct.
-  Play Australia's most popular summer sport of cricket. Keep practicing and you might just be good enough to play in The Ashes one day.
-  As well as the females' pouches, kangaroos are known for their boxing skills. Males balance on their tails and fight to establish dominance. Have a go at boxing or go head to head in a balancing competition.
-  Have a game of "Kooka" "Burra" as a twist on the Marco Polo game.

Why?

Kookaburras call at dusk and dawn to establish their family's territory. This also warns off members of other kookaburra families, but rival families that hear the call may respond. Members of the same family may call together, but those alone in captivity won't laugh or sing because it is a social behaviour.

-  Challenge your friends to a joke competition. Who can make people laugh like a kookaburra the most?
-  Dig for treasure in a sandpit. Wombats have sharp claws and short legs which make them great diggers. Why not try using different objects to dig with to see which is the most effective?
-  Australia hosted the Melbourne 1956 and Sydney 2000 Summer Olympic Games, and will host the Brisbane games in 2032. Hold your own mini games or sports day.

-  Give someone a hug like a koala.
-  Learn the words and sing the “Kookaburra sits in the old gum tree” song.
-  Did you know that ostriches don’t actually bury their head in the sand when they are scared? Try this yourself and confront a problem you’re facing.
-  Put on or rehearse a musical performance fit for the Sydney Opera House.
-  Sunbathe or swim outdoors like a Saltwater Crocodile, but remember your sun cream so you don’t turn into a Galah bird!
-  Ninety per cent of Australians live on the coast. Take a trip to the beach.
-  Australia is in the Southern Hemisphere which means that their seasons are opposite to those in the Northern Hemisphere. Hold a celebration in a different season, such as Christmas in the summer.
-  Find out some facts about the different indigenous peoples of Australia.
-  The island of Tasmania has the cleanest air in the world. Spend some time in a local green space to breath in the fresh air.
-  There is more snow in the Australian Alps than the Swiss Alps. Have a go at skiing or snowboarding at your local indoor or dry slope.
-  Face a fear and try something new. Australian zookeeper, conservationist and wildlife television presenter Steve Irwin’s greatest fear was of parrots.
-  Koalas have two thumbs on each front paw to give them extra grip. Test your grip strength on some monkey bars, a traverse course or a climbing wall.
-  Many of Australia’s native animals are nocturnal. Go for a night-time walk.
-  Visit a zoo to meet some Australian animals such as wallabies, koalas, kangaroos or wombats.
-  Around 2.5km of Uluru, also known as Ayers Rock, extends underground. Have a go at an activity that is typically underground such as caving.
-  Read a scratch and sniff book to test your Tasmanian Devil sense of smell.
-  Have a go at snorkelling which is a popular adventure activity, particularly around the Great Barrier Reef.
