## To make your cards:

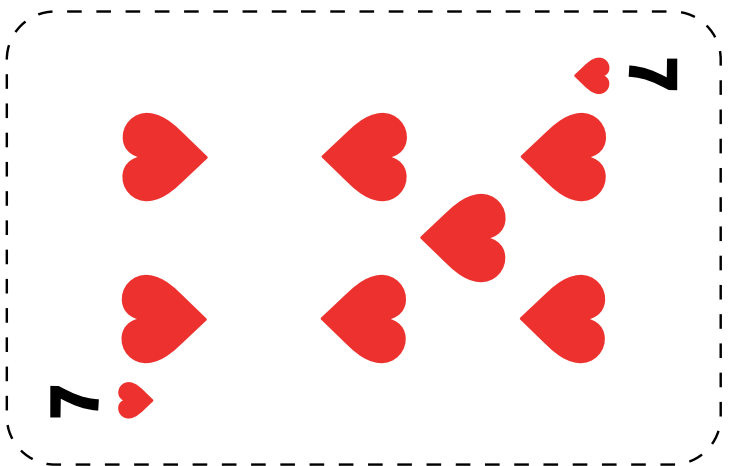
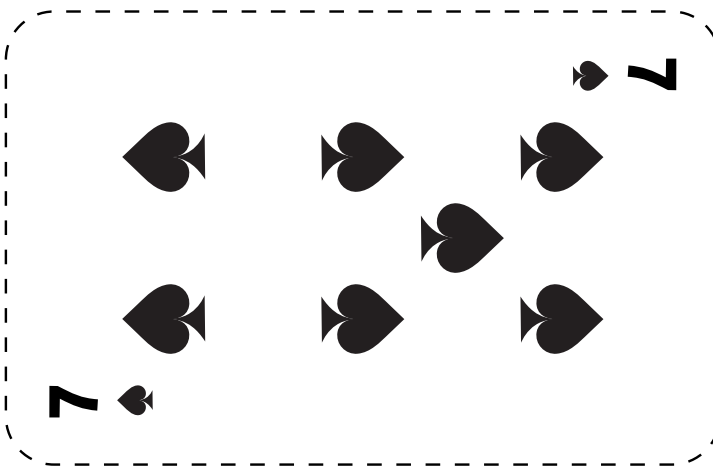
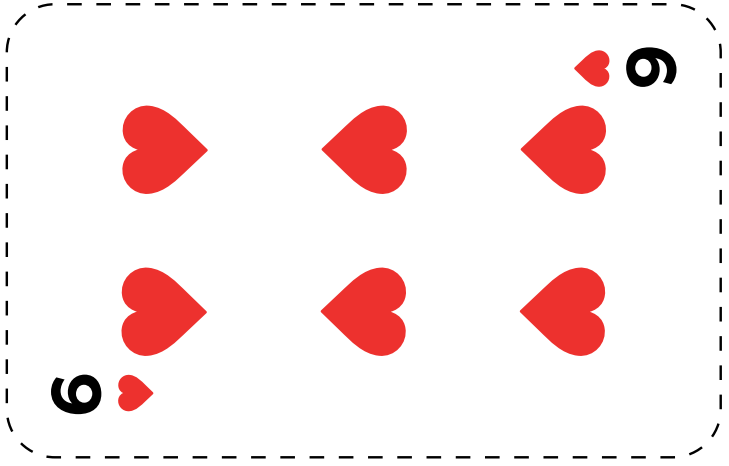
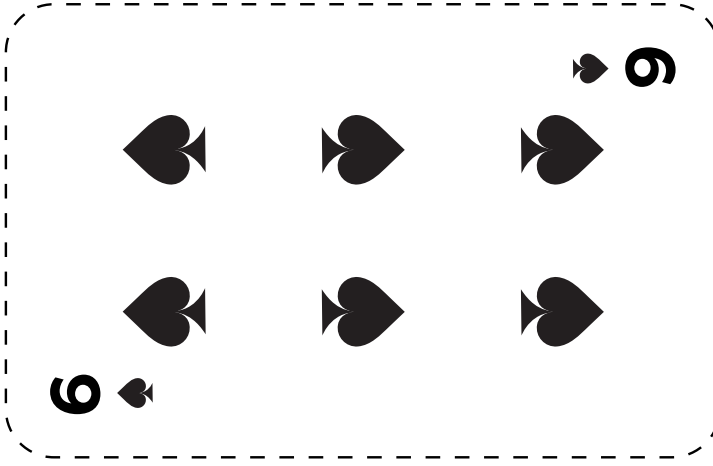
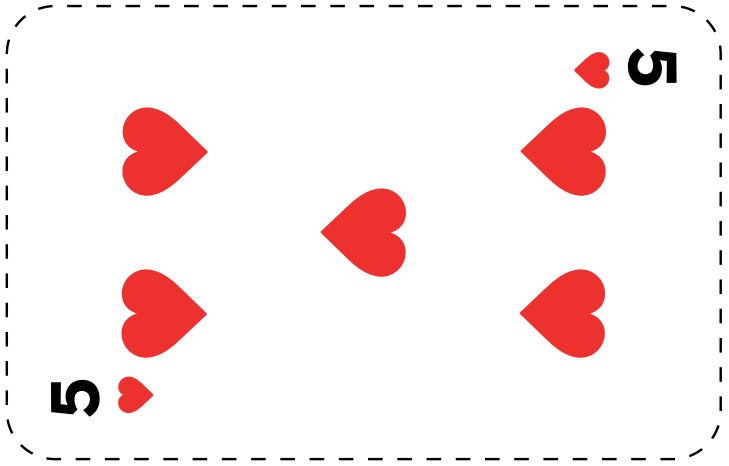
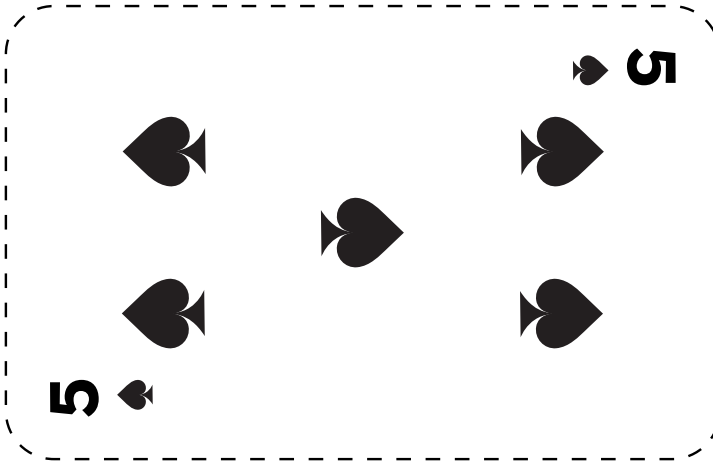
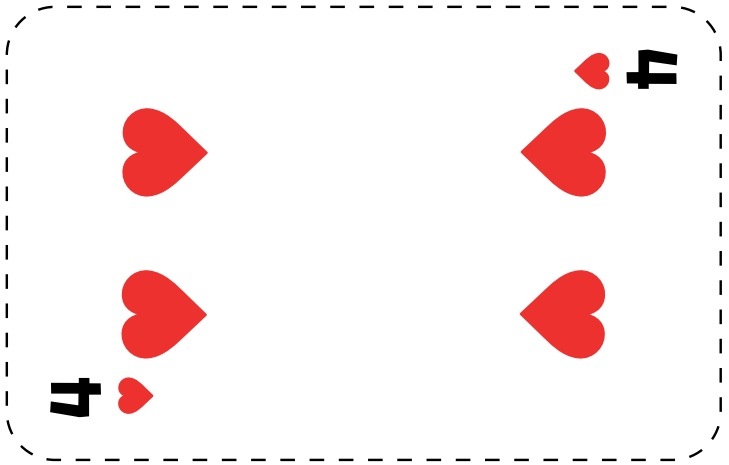
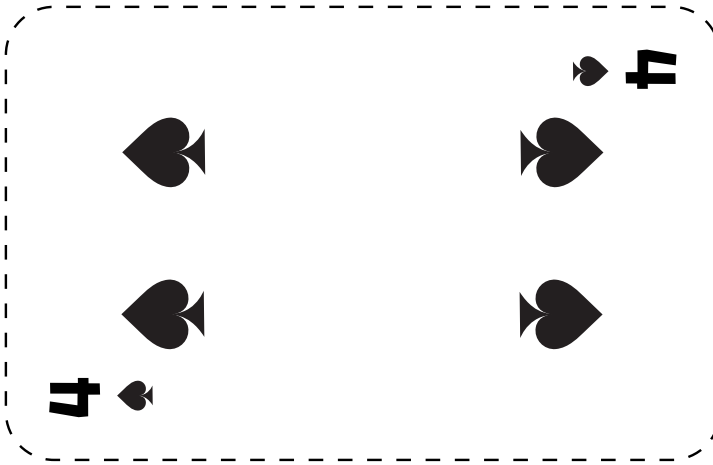
1. Print this resource onto on to thin card or printer paper then stick on to cereal box.

4. Your cards are ready to play a game or perform a magic trick with!



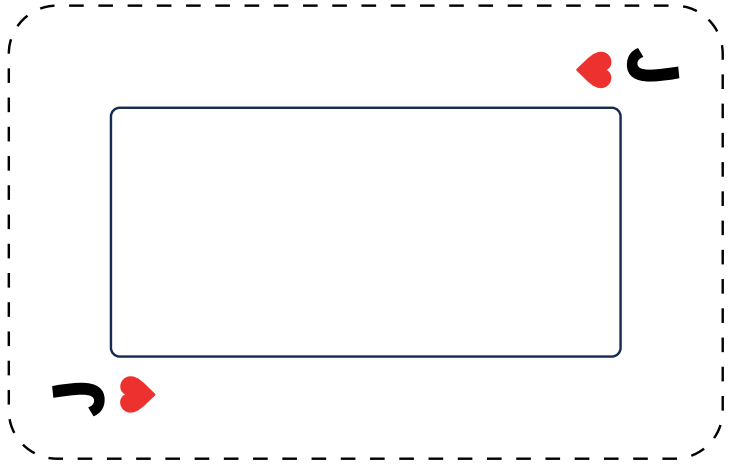
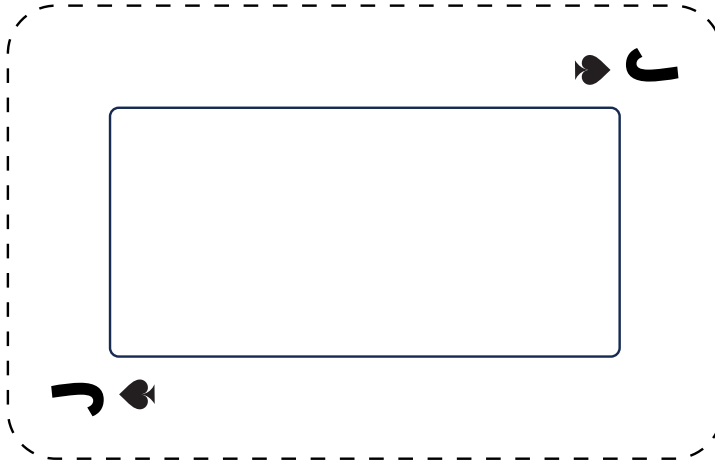
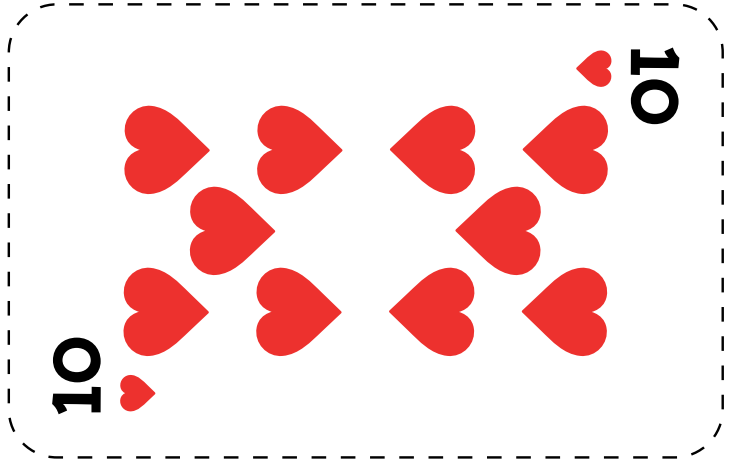
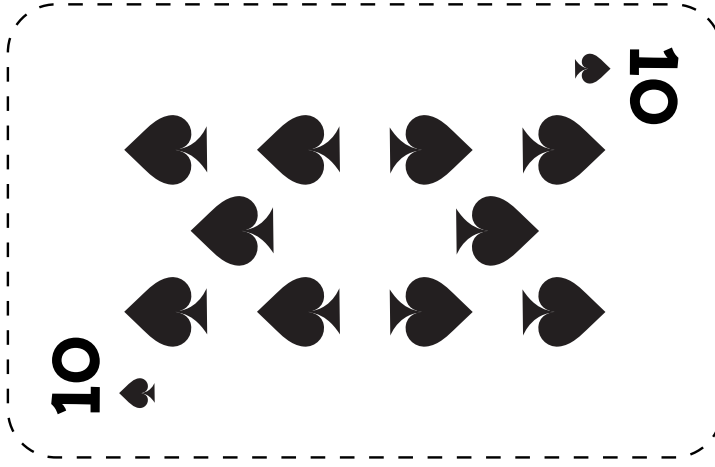
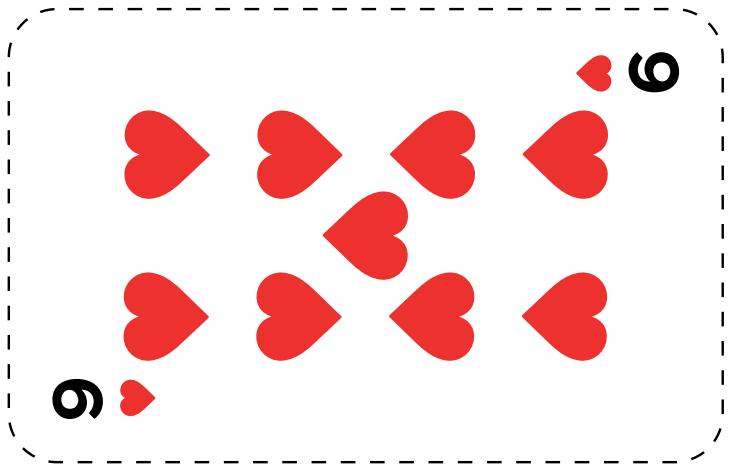
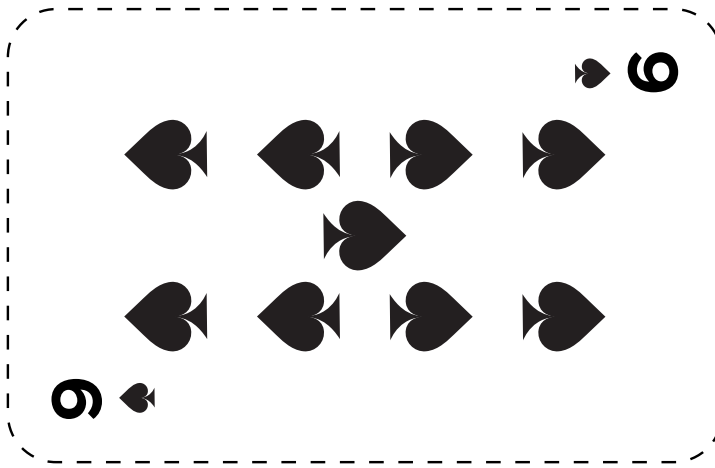
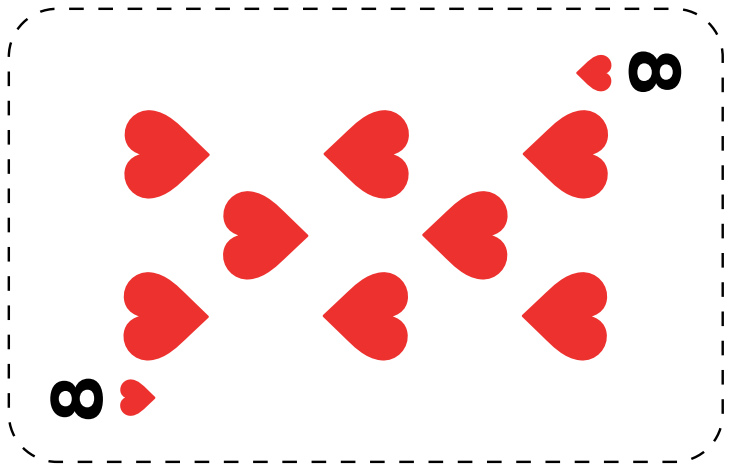
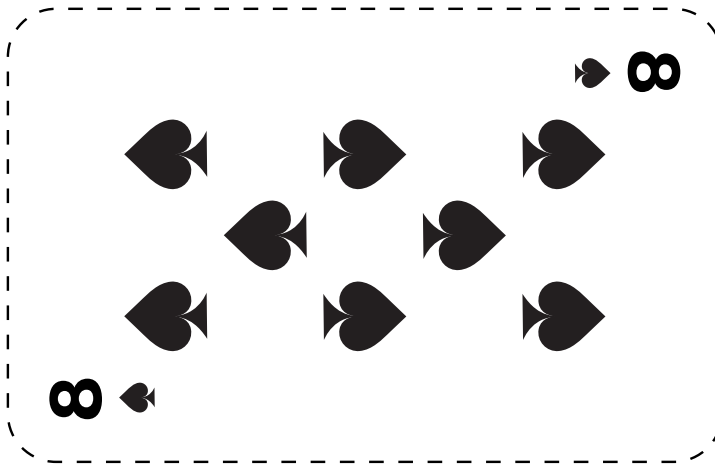
The Ace of Spades card often has an elaborate swirly pattern. Why not try creating your own design here?



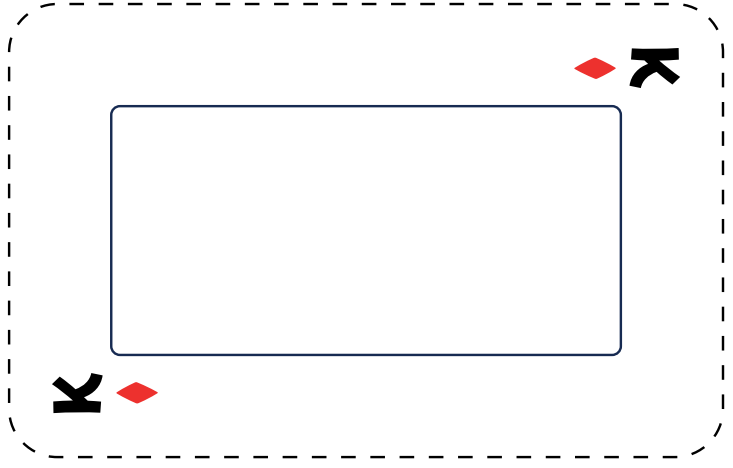
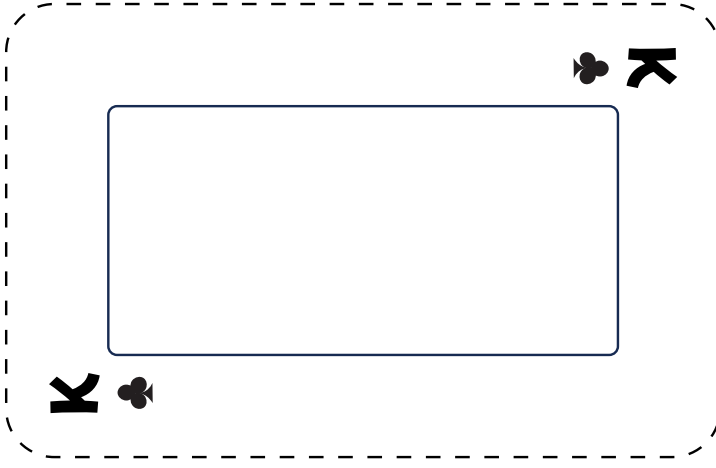
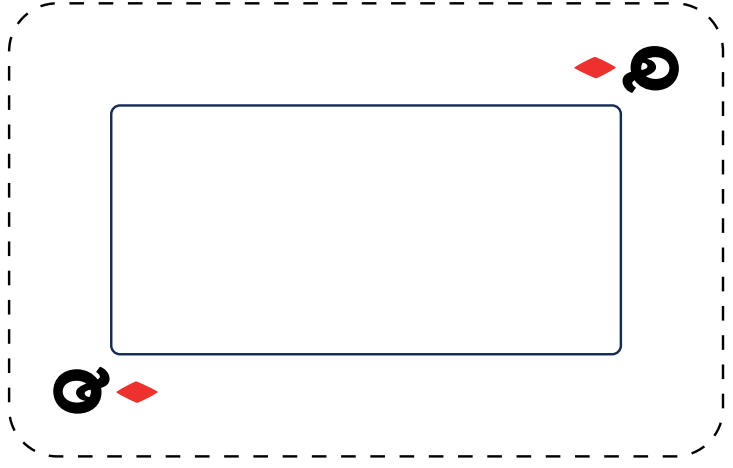
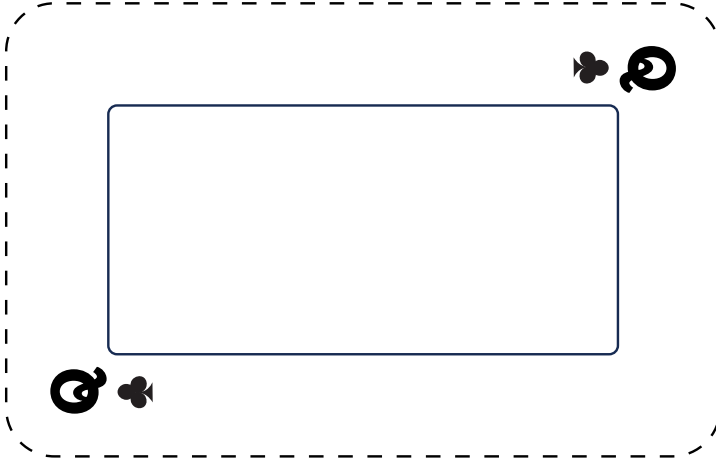
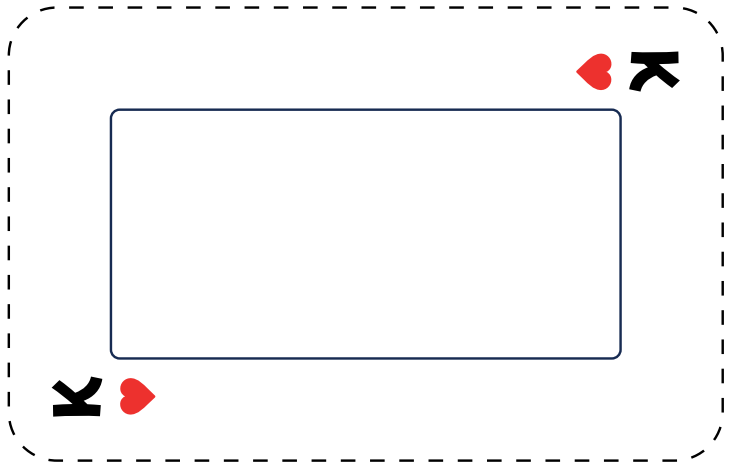
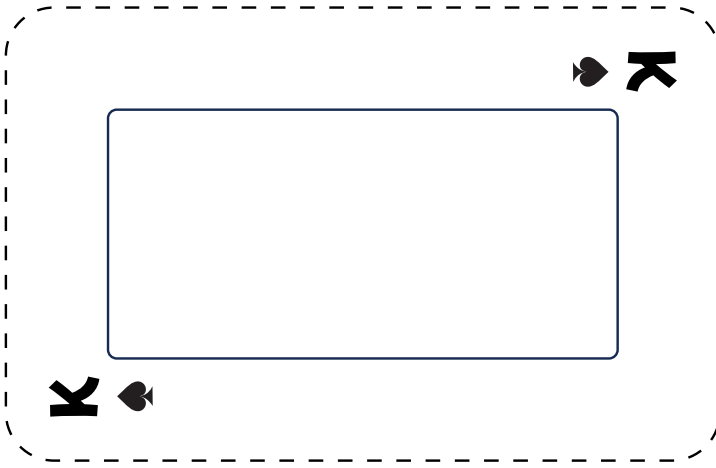
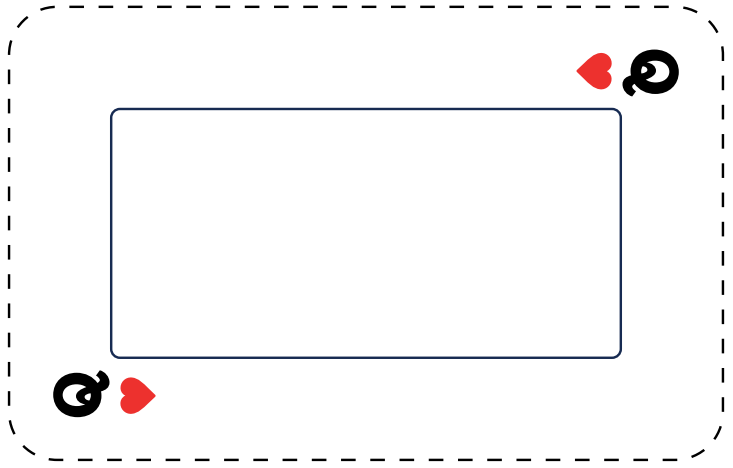
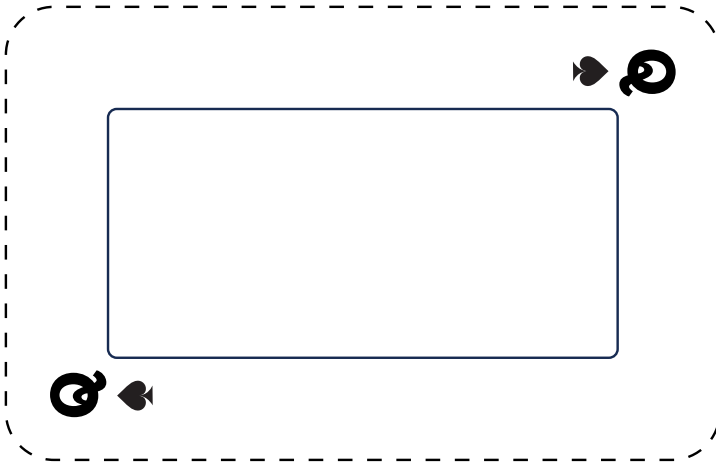
