GUIDANCE NOTES For Applicants & Supporters



The Pawprint Trust will accept applications between 1st January 2024 and 31st March 2024. Successful applicants will receive decisions no later than 31st May 2024. Forms received outside of these dates will not be accepted.

The Pawprint Trust is open to all young people and the following conditions apply to **applications**:

- Applicants must be age 11 to 25 years (inclusive) at the time of the project and be resident in the UK.
- The young person must complete the written application form unless they are unable to. See guidance below. 'If you are a young person and unable to complete the application yourself'.
- A young person may apply as an individual, on behalf of a team of young people who will share the grant money equally or an organisation where the money will be used by most/all of the members.
- Only one application per person, per year will be accepted.
- Projects cannot be funded if they take place prior to 31st May 2024.
- Applications can not be considered retrospectively (if the project has already taken place).
- Domestic and international projects are considered equally.
- Applications completed incorrectly will not be considered.
- Funds are limited only by the total funds available. There is no limit to individual grant amounts.

All applicants are encouraged to take into account this **guidance** when completing their applications:

- Complete application form fully, completely and in detail.
- Send all pages and evidence in one envelope/email.
- Please do not send your application multiple times i.e. by email and post.
- Make full use of space provided and continue using the additional sheet if necessary.
- Ensure all information is personal, thorough and clear; detailing the need for funding, how grant money will be used and the wider impact of the funding to yourself/wider community.
- Evidence of fundraising/planning should be clear including amounts raised.
- Applicants are responsible for ensuring that forms are received prior to the deadline. We cannot accept forms after the deadline due to postal delays/other circumstances.

Each application should be accompanied by a **supporting statement** and the following considered:

- The individual providing the statement should know the young person well (i.e. a leader, teacher, etc) and should not be a member of your family.
- Any special consideration necessary (including special educational needs, family circumstances and/ or extenuating circumstances) should be detailed in the supporting statement.

The following applications will not be accepted:

- Requests to support or start-up businesses.
- Support for educational course requirements even if they are of a voluntary or adventurous nature.
- Funding for educational courses or equipment to attend formal education.
- Applications from main stream educational providers for extra-curricular trips or activities.
 Applications from a young person/individual for funds to attend such an activity would be considered.
- Applications for provision funded by central or local government.
- Requests for funds for personal medical equipment needed as part of day to day living. Applications
 for some additional support in order to participate in a specific project or activity that meet our
 'everyday adventure' criteria may be considered.
- Funding for qualifications, even if these were to be used in a voluntary capacity.
- Applications for rent and general running costs, e.g. utilities, insurance, refreshments, etc. Applications for activity equipment to be used on a regular basis would be considered.
- Grants for supporting another charity's general funds but support for specific projects that support 'everyday adventure' will be considered.

GUIDANCE NOTES For Applicants & Supporters



If you are a young person and unable to complete the application yourself:

- A parent/guardian may complete the application form on your behalf. Please ensure the name and date of birth on the application are yours and not those of the person completing the form on your behalf.
- The supporting statement outlines the reasons the application form can not be completed by you.
- As far as possible, the Trustees would like to hear your 'voice' in the application and welcome alternative media to provide this, e.g. video, photos, artwork, etc.
- Please ensure all details from the application form are provided in or alongside any alternative application.

If your application is successful you will be required to provide photos and receipts as proof of purchase for specific items along with a short written report detailing how funding from the Pawprint Trust helped support you in your project. By submitting an application you agree to the details being used at the discretion of the Trust and Pawprint Family for the promotion/advertising of the Trust and its work.

If for any reason your project does not take place, the Pawprint Trust reserves the right to request any grants made be returned.
