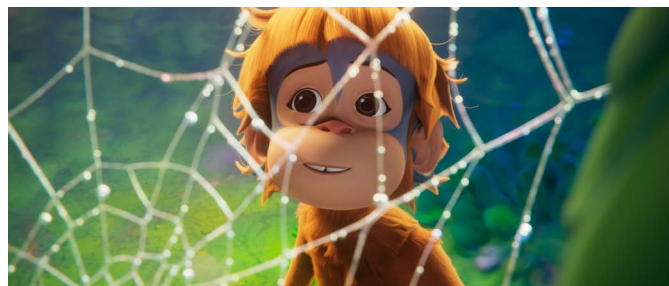

Meet Ozi, a little orphan orangutan who's about to make a big difference when she goes on an epic adventure to save her forest home.

Separated from her parents when their forest home is destroyed, Ozi is taken in by kind wildlife sanctuary owners who keep her safe and slowly teach her to communicate through sign language. With the combination of her new skills and natural talent for social media, Ozi soon has a worldwide following.

When she learns that her parents might be alive, Ozi sets off on a quest to find them and to tell the world what is happening to the rainforest before it's too late. With help from new friends, cheeky monkey Chance and loveable rhino Honkus, Ozi discovers that one voice really can change the world.

Now it is your chance to find your voice for nature like Ozi, with lots of exciting challenges to try to earn your Ozi: Voice of the Forest Challenge Badge.



HOW TO: Use Your Challenge Pack



This Challenge Pack has been divided into 4 sections: Craft, Food, Games and Other. In order to help you provide a balanced and varied programme for your young adventurers we recommend that the following number of activities are completed by each age group:

Award yourselves a badge for supporting your young adventurers in their activities!

TOP TIPS

- Adapt activities as necessary to meet your needs.
- Add your own activity ideas or develop them into projects.
- Use what you have; don't buy in lots of new materials/equipment.
- No need to send us evidence, responsible grown-ups decide when the badge has been earned.
- One challenge badge can take as long as you like; from a few hours to days or even a full term!

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Craft

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- ✿ Build a 3D model to show what a rainforest looks like before and after it has been impacted by deforestation. Destruction of forests is a real problem which Ozi raises in her story.
- ✿ Build a bug hotel as a home for local insects using twigs and leaves.
- ✿ Make your own melting polar ice caps by freezing some bowls of water, placing them into a container and seeing how long they take to melt.

Why?

Our warming climate is causing glaciers to melt. When a glacier melts, more water is added to the ocean, causing a rise in sea levels which will result in coastal areas suffering from flooding. This activity is great for helping children to visualise what happens when a glacier melts and what it leaves behind afterwards. What other facts can you find out about climate change and what can we do to limit it?

- ✿ Collect different shaped and coloured leaves and use them to make a wild art picture. Why not see if you can make a picture of Ozi?
- ✿ Create an Ozi themed poster to inform people in your community about the impact that deforestation or climate change is having on our planet (even better, create a poster for each!).
- ✿ Learn about the climate stripes pattern and how each of the stripes shows the planet's temperature warming over many years at <https://showyourstripes.info/s/globe>.
- ✿ Use different coloured craft paper to recreate the climate stripes for different countries around the world. Pop this into your window to inspire others to think about climate change #ShowYourStripes.
- ✿ Knit a blanket using old scraps of wool that you could use for picnics or to keep you warm at home instead of turning up the heating.

What?

It's great if we can keep the heating off for a little bit longer. When we turn on the heating, we are releasing carbon dioxide and other gases into the atmosphere. These gases contribute to the warming of our climate so it is important we are all doing our bit to reduce using them where possible.

- ✿ Put together an outfit for an adventure in the forest. What else might you bring along?



Food

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- Put together some edible greenhouse gas models using toothpicks/cocktail sticks and coloured gummy sweets.
- Ozi is helped by Kirani and Robert who are owners of a local sanctuary for orphaned orangutans. Do your bit to help too and bake some cupcakes to sell and raise money for a charity that supports orangutans such as International Animal Rescue or Sumatran Orangutan Conservation Programme.
- Try making some Earth toast.

How?

Make edible paint by adding food colouring to a couple of tablespoons of milk and mix well. For this recipe you will need to make blue and green paint so split the milk into two small bowls or containers. Then cut a circle in the middle of a slice of bread, you could cut this free hand or use a circle cookie cutter and paint it to look like the Earth (make sure not to use too much of the edible paint as it will not crisp up)! To finish, place your Earth back in the middle of the bread and toast in the toaster or under the grill. Use whatever toppings you would like and enjoy this delicious snack whilst talking to your family, friends or group about the impacts of global warming.

- One of the many changes we can make to prevent climate change is to eat less meat and dairy. Prepare a meal using only plant-based ingredients.
- Check the packaging on the food you buy in the supermarket, if it contains palm oil, check it's sourced sustainably. Is it detailed in their ingredients list or website? Does it have a sustainable palm oil logo?

What?




Palm oil is used in a lot of our favourite foods such as cakes and chocolate. Some palm oil has been produced on land which used to be forest, but sustainable palm oil hadn't harmed forests, wildlife or the people who live there. It is important that we look to buy products that use sustainable palm oil as this has many benefits and does not contribute to deforestation.

- Pack a picnic to go for an adventure in the forest.
- Whip up some foraged fruit pancakes
- Bake a cake using sustainable palm oil ingredients and decorate it to look like Ozi.
- Fix up an edible forest using broccoli and pretzel sticks.






Games

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-  Go on a wildlife scavenger hunt using the free resource on our website.
-  Play a game of Hide and Seek in the forest or at your local area of natural beauty such as a park or garden.
-  Go wild and take part in a rainforest animal twist on 'Simon Says'.



How?

Get a group of players together, the more the better. 'Simon' is chosen from group and stands in front of the other players. Instead of simple actions, 'Simon' will pretend to be different rainforest animals, slithering like a snake, swinging like an orangutan and roaring like a lion etc. For example, 'Simon says, stomp like an elephant'.

-  Use your voice by communicating with your friends, family or group in the 'Telephone Game'. You can find out more on how to play this game online or find out from a friend that has played before.
-  Complete a climate change word search. You could have a go at one you have found online yourself or try creating one for somebody else.
-  Challenge yourself and a group to a game of 'Find Your Tree' in a forest or area of natural beauty.


What?

Pick one player to start who will be blindfolded. Spin the player around and lead them to a tree. The player can use any of their other senses to smell the tree, feel the bark etc. The goal is to guess the correct tree after walking away and taking the blindfold off.

-  Create your very own rainforest animal top trumps. You could include the animal's weight, speed and how many of them are left in the wild. This is not only an entertaining game but also a great way of finding out more about extinct species.
-  Go on a litter pick and collect plastic bottles. Wash and clean them out then make them into a set of skittles to play with.

Why?

It is important that we reuse materials as this helps to prevent pollution of nasty gases in our environment, helping climate change.

-  Take part in a recycling relay race to see who can sort waste into the correct bins the quickest.



Other

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BADGES

- Take a trip to the cinema to see *Ozi: Voice of the Forest*. You can see it first on the 10th & 11th of August at selected screenings and it will be available everywhere from the 16th of August.
- We can reduce climate change by walking or cycling instead of travelling in a car. Reduce your carbon footprint by travelling a different way to school each day. You could track your progress by putting together a chart that shows how you travelled and how long it took.
- Build a den using fallen branches and twigs.
- In *Ozi: Voice of the Forest*, Ozi works out how to communicate through sign language. Learn how to say 'I love trees' in sign language.
- Write a letter to your MP asking them to plant more trees in your local area.
- Go for a walk in the forest and try to spot some wildlife. Why not bring a notebook along with you to sketch or write information about different species?
- Ozi shares her voice with the world to spread an important message about making a difference. How could you encourage others to make a change?
- Discover Birmingham's Science Museum: the 'Thinktank', in particular the 'Our Changing Planet' gallery which explores how climate change is affecting wildlife and the environment.
- Plant some flowers in a pot to sit on your doorstep or window ledge to feed bees and other pollinators.
- Trees are important for so many reasons, especially for the environment. Appreciate nature and hug a tree.
- Read a book about deforestation such as 'There's a Rang-Tan in my Bedroom' by James Sellick or 'Greta and the Giants' by Zoë Tucker.
- Visit the Eden Project located in Cornwall, England to find out more about the natural world and what we can do to reduce climate change.
- Ozi is supported through her journey to protect the forests and find her parents by her friends Chance and Honkus. Think about a time where a friend has supported you through a tough time. What advice would you give to a friend if they had a problem?
