




HOW TO: Use Your Challenge Pack

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Craft PAWP

- Make your own We're Going on a Bear Hunt character puppets using our free resource and put on a performance of the story for your family, friends or group.
- Have fun with nature and make some mud cakes. Decorate them with items you can find in the forest such as flowers, leaves, stones and sticks.
- Assemble some binoculars using toilet roll tubes to bring along to your next outdoor adventure.
- Create a bear track stamp by carving the shapes into a potato. Dip the stamp into brown paint and experiment with printing.
- Draw out a Bear Hunt map as a retelling of the events from the story. You could use craft materials to show the different textures.
- Paint a textured picture of a bear using a fork.
- "One shiny wet nose! Two big furry ears! Two big goggly eyes!" Craft a bear mask using a paper plate and coloured craft paper.
- Construct some nature paint brushes by attaching leaves or flowers to sticks.
- 🍟 Craft your very own hiking stick.

How?

Find a stick that is around the same height as you, peel off the bark and sand it down until it is smooth. Spend time decorating your stick and making it unique to you using a variety of materials such as feathers, pipe cleaners, string, coloured tape and beads. Take your stick on your next hike or walk – can you find more things to add like feathers or threads?

- Build a bear cave out of junk model materials.
- "Splash splosh! Splash splosh! Splash splosh!" Enjoy splashing about and paint a picture using coloured water or paint a picture in the rain.
- Put together a collage using different coloured leaves.
- Form a natural mobile using materials that you have collected on your adventures.
- Have a go at making DIY snow using baking soda and shaving cream. Enjoy drawing pictures in your snow or making bear pawprint trails.

Tood



- Experiment with writing using a natural ingredient ink made up of freshly picked berries (or shop bought if you can't get out and about), vinegar and salt.
- Fix up some bear claw cookies using four chocolate buttons to decorate.
- Bake a chocolate mud cake. Find a recipe or use a family favourite either way this cake will taste even better after a day out exploring.
- 👛 Enjoy some bear toast.

How?

Toast your bread of choice to your liking and spread caramelised biscuit flavour spread or peanut butter on top. Create a bear face by slicing up banana for the ears and snout and blueberries to represent the eyes and nose.

- Try making some edible acorns by dipping grapes into chocolate (only half way) and leaving to set.
- Build a forest den using savoury twig shaped snacks.
- Whip up your own squelchy mud dessert cups using crushed chocolate biscuits and chocolate mousse as the base and jelly worms for decoration.
- Make edible grass by mixing shredded coconut, green food colouring and water. Use it to decorate a cake, biscuits or other snack.
- In the book *We're Going on a Bear Hunt*, a family go on an outdoor adventure where they face many different obstacles including long grass, a river, thick mud, a forest a snowstorm and a cave. Make a list of food items you would bring with you in a packed lunch if you went on a Bear Hunt.

Here's an idea!

For an additional challenge you could come up with food items that represent each of the areas of the Bear Hunt. For example, blue jelly for the river or pretzel sticks for the forest.

- Put together an edible tree using spinach and bread sticks.
- "Back through the snowstorm! Hoooo wooooo! Hoooo wooooo!" Enjoy making some snowman biscuits by decorating with white icing and a marshmallow to make it look as if the snowman is melting onto the biscuit.
- Hold a We're Going on a Bear Hunt themed buffet.

Games





Act out the story of We're Going on a Bear Hunt.



Challenge your family, friends or group to a bridge stick race.



Enjoy some sensory play with a bare foot walk.

How?

To play this game you will need five trays large enough for players to step into them. Fill each tray with something, each one to represent the different parts of the Bear Hunt: grass, mud, water, forest and snow. For example, you could use small twigs for the forest and ice for the snowstorm. You could even read the story out loud as the players walk through the different trays for the ultimate immersive experience!



Take part in an outdoor scavenger hunt and take photos of what objects you find for evidence. You can make your own or use our free 'Wildlife Scavenger Hunt' resource on our website.



Get into two teams and see which team can make a bridge out of sticks and stones the quickest. You could use the bridge to help you cross the river.



Play a game of 'Follow the Leader' but with a beary fun twist.

What?

One player is chosen to be the 'detective' and closes their eyes. Another player is chosen as the 'leader' (this is done in silence so that the detective doesn't know who the leader is). The leader starts a movement of their choice but it must be part of the story *We're Going on a Bear Hunt*. For example, tiptoeing through the cave, stumbling through the forest or splashing through the river. The rest of the players should copy whatever movement the leader is doing. The leader can change their movement whenever they want. The detective opens their eyes and tries to guess correctly who the leader is.



Identify the object from nature in a blindfold memory game. Talk about how the object feels – is it smooth? Bumpy? Cold?



Practice your bear walks and set up your very own bear trail. Print off paw prints and cut them out before sticking down on the floor to make a trail.

Here's an idea!


Why not create a bear themed treasure hunt for somebody to follow using the trail?



"Squelch squerch!" Play the classic playground game "Stuck in the Mud".

Other







Explore your local area and discover different textures to walk on.



Think of a time where you have had to face a challenge where you couldn't go over it, couldn't go under it, you had to go through it. How did you face this challenge and what advice could you give to others going through a similar problem?

Visit your local park or area of natural beauty.

Retell the story of We're Going on a Bear Hunt. Why not use our Bear Hunt puppet resource to help you?

Create your own snowstorm with shredded newspaper.

Donate to a charity that supports wild bears.

Pack a bag or put together a checklist of what you would take with you on an adventure. Don't forget your raincoat...just in case!

Pretend to be one of the characters from We're Going on a Bear Hunt and write your own diary entry as if you were out on the hunt yourself.

Watch the 2016 film *We're Going on a Bear Hunt* (rated U).

Grab a copy and explore the outdoors with the book We're Going on a Bear Hunt Nature Adventures: 30 Outdoor Activities for Young Explorers All Year Round.

We're Going on a Bear Hunt was voted one of the BBC's greatest children's books of all time. Debate with your family, friends or group to see which book/s you think are best. Can you make it into a shortlist of 5?

At the end of the We're Going on a Bear Hunt story, the family hide away from the bear under the covers. Create your own cosy fort to hide in, complete with as many blankets, cushions and duvets you can find.
