




# HOW TO: Use Your Challenge Pack


#### How Do I Track My Progress?

- The Wonders of the World are seven of the most iconic landmarks in the world. Design your own building with innovative shapes and materials.
- Create a silhouette painting of your favourite Wonder of the World.

#### How?

Start off by painting your background a colour of your choice. You can mix colours together to create a realistic sky scene, but we recommend using no more than two colours as this can cause your painting to look too busy and the silhouette will not be as visible. Once you have painted your background, leave it to dry completely, then sketch out your 'Wonder of the World' e.g. the Colosseum or the Great Wall of China' using a pencil. When you are happy with your design, colour in your sketch using black paint or a black felt tip pen.

- Paint a picture of Christ the Redeemer in Brazil.
- Put together an outfit you would wear to explore one or more of the Seven Wonders of the World. You could even pack a bag and pretend you are traveling to each one.
- Did you know that The Colosseum is one of the top 10 (when writing this pack in 2024) largest Lego sets ever produced, containing over 9,000 pieces? Try building your own version, perhaps with not so many bricks...
- Learn more about the home of Machu Picchu by taking part in some Nazca Line mark making using paper, sand and something with a round, small tip such as the end of a paintbrush.

#### What?

The Nazca Lines are a group of large designs etched into the sand of the Nazca Desert in southern Peru. Many of the lines form images such as a monkey, an astronaut and a spider. They were discovered in 1926 by Toribio Mejia Xesspe and have been a mystery to many ever since, although there have been many theories.

- The Taj Mahal in India was built by Emperor Shah Jahan between the years of 1631 and 1648 and was in memory of his beloved wife Mumtaz Mahal who sadly died. The name 'Taj Mahal' means 'Crown of Palaces' in Persian Craft your own paper crown, complete with decoration of your choice.
- Build a 3D model of Chichén Itzá using cardboard or junk model materials.
- Assemble a collage of the different flags that are home to the Seven Wonders of the World China, India, Italy, Brazil, Jordan, Mexico and Peru.

# T Food



- Output Properties of the World themed buffet where you include traditional foods from each of the seven countries.
- The recognisable dome on the top of the Taj Mahal is often referred to as the 'Onion Dome' due to it's colour and shape. Put together an edible version of the Taj Mahal, complete with a real onion to represent the dome.
- Build The Great Wall of China using rice cereal and marshmallow or sugar cubes.

#### Did you know?

All of the sections of the Great Wall of China add up to around 21,196 kilometres long (13,171 miles). It took over 2,500 years to build and was a combined effort by many different people over the years, this included soldiers and convicts.

- The ancient city of Petra in Jordan is often referred to as the 'Rose City' due to the stone colour used within many of it's buildings – Try a new recipe that includes rosewater to provide a unique, fragrant flavour. Why not use some edible dried rose petals to decorate your dish?
- Chichén Itzá is a former Mayan city and is an active archaeological site. Put together an edible archaeological dig with edible artifacts and chocolate soil.
- Make a grazing board filled with a variety of your favourite fruit and nuts to enjoy whilst watching a film with your friends, family or group.

#### Why?

Gladiators took part in fights against one another in the Colosseum and people would come and watch the fights. It has been said that spectators may have enjoyed snacks such as fruit and nuts as remains of these foods have since been discovered during an archaeological dig.

- India's national fruit is the mango and is known as the 'King of the Fruits' Prepare a dish that uses mango. Some examples might include a mango sorbet, smoothie, salad or fruit tart.
- Arrange a platter of red, white, green and black foods to represent the Jordan flag. For a savoury platter you could use tomatoes, mozzarella, basil and black olives or for a sweet version, try strawberries, marshmallows, pistachios and dark chocolate.
- Taste test some classic Italian desserts such as Panna Cotta, Cannoli or Gelato. Why not have a go at making your own?

# Games



- Historians believe that Soccer (or Football as you may know it) originated in China in around 1000BC. Challenge a group to a game or have a kick around individually.
- Diwali is a big celebration in India. Play a game of Create Diwali (ladieskitty. net).

#### How?

Each player places a paper plate on their head and draws the following: Two candles and two diyas, a swastika and write 'Happy Diwali'.

When complete everyone looks at their drawing and scores themselves as follows:

- 5 points if the candles are not touching each other 2 points if they are.
- 4 points if the diyas are not overlapping and 2 if they are.
- 3 points if the swastika is in the correct shape and 1 point if it is not.
- 10 points for writing Happy Diwali in one line and 5 points if it is not.
- Play a game of 'Great Wall of China', an similar alternative to a 'British Bulldog' style game.

#### How?

All players must begin standing in a line, if playing indoors this might be up against a wall. A 'tagger' is then selected and they must shout 'Great Wall' to allow the other players to start running across to the other side of the room, field etc. Players who are tagged start forming a wall along the centre line, holding their arms and legs out. The game continues and as time goes on, the wall grows bigger. This is a perfect way to explain to children that the Great Wall of China was built over a long period of time by many different people.

- Snakes and Ladders is said to have originated in India and was introduced in the UK in 1892. Go head to head in a game or create your own version based on the Wonders of the World.
- Have your own 'Battle of the Oranges'.

#### What?

Held in Ivrea, Italy and dating back to Medieval times, the Battle of the Oranges is part of their Mardi Gras traditions. The battle includes the throwing of oranges between organized groups and is the largest food fight in Italy. Turn this idea into a game of dodgeball.

Print or draw some pictures of the Wonders of the World and use them to create your own Snap or Bingo cards.



- Visit a library to find out more about the Wonders of the World.
- The Taj Mahal is a famous mausoleum in India. Find out what a mausoleum is and what it is used for.
- Listen to some traditional Mexican Mariachi music.
- Research some local human-made tourist destinations that you believe should be classed as one of the Wonders of the World.

#### Here's an idea!

For an additional activity, you could write a letter to UNESCO explaining why you think the destination should be one of the Wonders of the World.

- Christ the Redeemer took nine years to complete. Find out how long each of the other Wonders of the World took to build. Which took the longest?
- Take a look at some Brazilian Samba dancing. Why not try your hand at some of the dances yourself?
- Over 70% of the world's alpaca population live in Peru. Visit a local alpaca farm or go on an alpaca walk.
- Create a basic travel guide for a friend explaining each Wonder of the World to them. For each of the countries you could include cuisine, culture, traditional activities and the weather throughout the year.
- Bollywood is one of the largest film industries in the world and made around \$1.3 billion in 2023. Watch a light-hearted Bollywood film - make sure to choose one with lots of dancing!
- Chinese inventor Cai Lun began the invention of paper in around 150AD. Find out more about how he invented it and create a short drama piece based on his process.
- Watch the BBC documentary The Seven Wonders of the World.
- Petra in Jordan is famous for it's beautifully carved rock architecture. Try sketching some of your own architectural rock masterpieces. Who knows, you might design the next Wonder of the World!
- Put together a budget and itinerary for a future visit to one of the Seven Wonders.
